FY26 Federal Funding Process

As an entitlement jurisdiction participating in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) programs, the City of Lakewood seeks proposals for CDBG- and ESG-eligible Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26) projects.

Lakewood anticipates receiving approximately \$1,800,000 in CDBG funding and approximately \$160,000 in ESG funding during FY26. Receipt of CDBG and ESG funding is restricted to qualified not-for-profit organizations and units of general local government.

CDBG projects must increase the quality and supply of decent, affordable housing; create and maintain a suitable living environment; eliminate slum and blight conditions; offer critical public services; or increase economic opportunity, principally for low-moderate income Lakewood households. ESG projects must provide Homelessness Prevention Assistance for extremely-low income Lakewood households.

Funding applications will be available by request from Lakewood's Department of Planning & Development beginning Monday, July 7, 2025. Completed applications and associated materials must be submitted no later than Friday, August 8, 2025.
