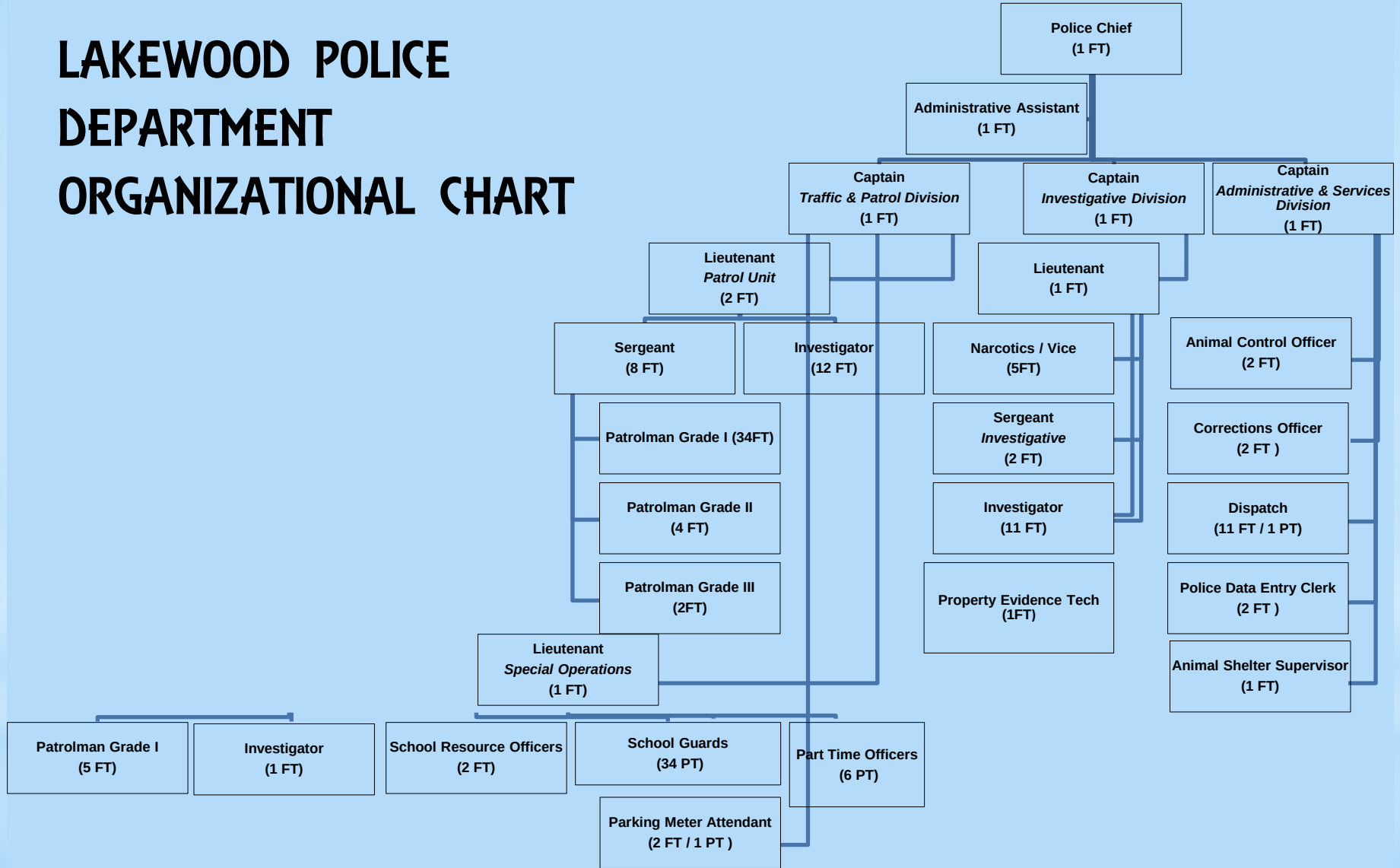
EXECUTIVE SUMMARY 2018

UNIFORM DIVISION

The Uniform Patrol Division continued to be the front line in our service to the community. The officers of this division have committed themselves to remaining visible in identified problem areas. They have been active in their pursuit of violators breaking our traffic and criminal laws. The Lakewood Police Departments goal of keeping Lakewood a safe community is advanced on a daily basis by the work of the Uniform Officers.



SPECIAL OPERATIONS

The officers assigned to the **Special Operations Unit** continue to work effectively with our residents, businesses, and youth of the community, whether in schools, parks, or on the streets. The **Neighborhood Police Officers** have been a very visible and positive presence in the community and have done exceptional work in keeping our citizens connected to the Lakewood Police Department. Programs such as the **Citizens Academy**, **Coffee with a Cop**, and **Cones with a Cop** are examples of the many ways the officers maintain their connections to our citizens. The **D.A.R.E.** officers work every day with the schools and youth in Lakewood to prepare them for the challenges that are ahead of them.



TRAINING UNIT

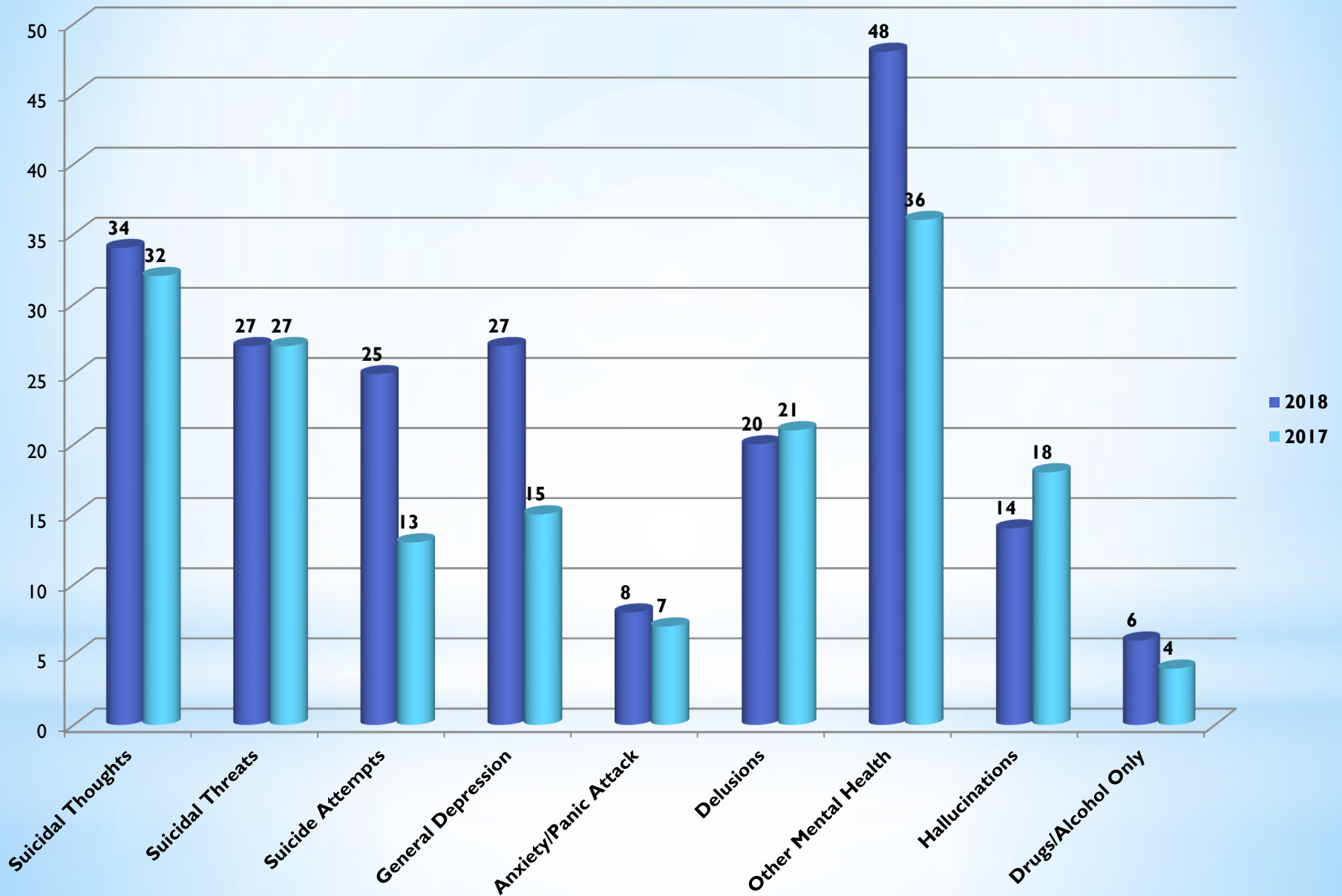
Our Training Division continues to do an excellent job in handling many different functions for the Department. The Lakewood Police Department stands apart from many of our contemporaries in the amount and depth of training we undertake each year. Appropriately training our police officers is one of the most important and cost effective ways to provide quality service to our citizens and to provide assurance to the City that we have been properly prepared to do our duty. In 2018 9,707.75 hours of training was provided to 121 different members. Due to assignments some members had more or less training , however, the training hours average out to 80 hours of training per employee.



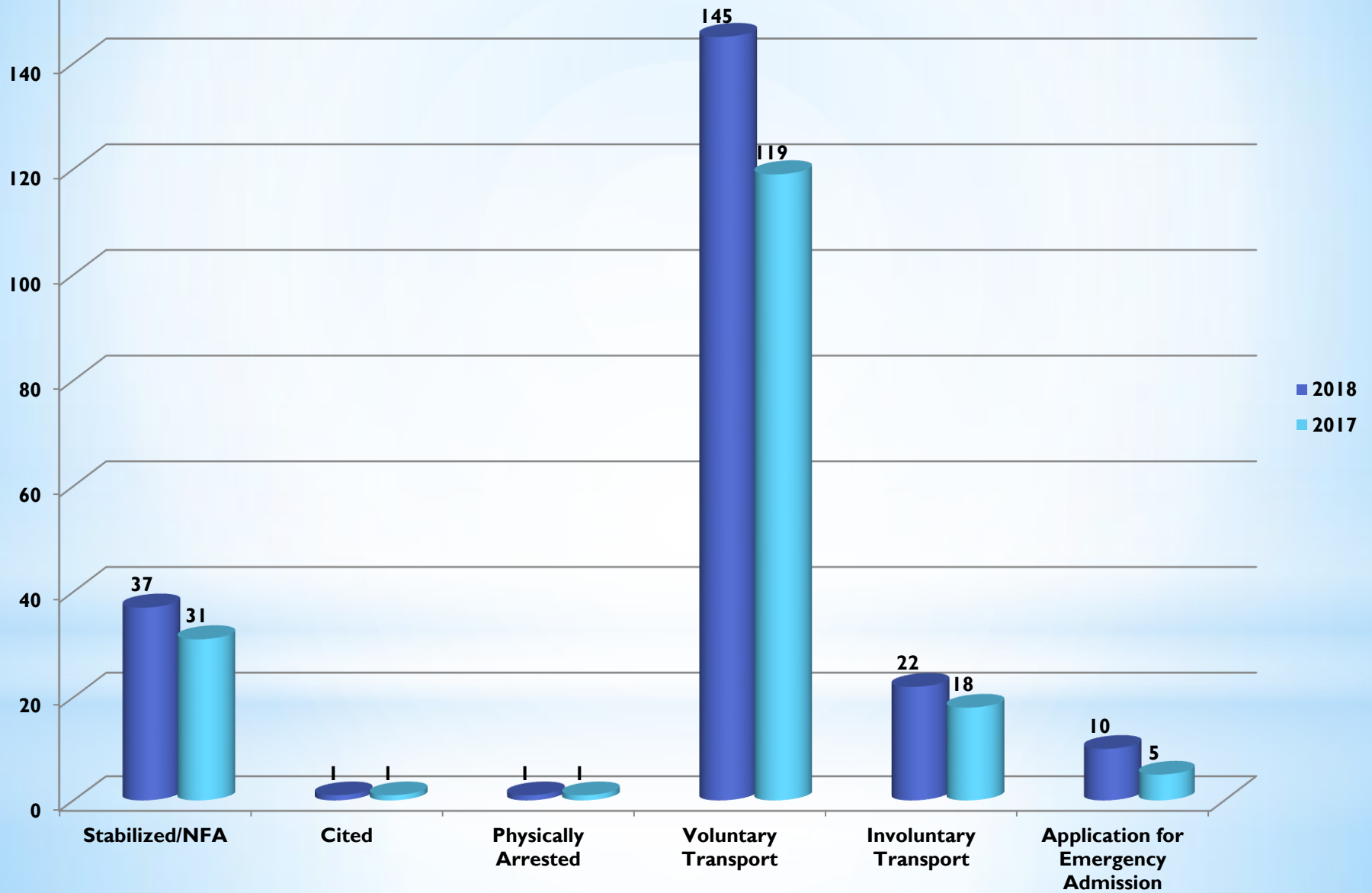
CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM

The Lakewood Police Department has continued to partner with the Westside Suburban Police Departments, and Frontline Services to provide appropriate training for responding to persons in mental health crisis's. The Crisis Intervention Team, (C.I.T.) has an officer respond to calls for service from persons experiencing mental health emergencies and provides those officers with the tools and referrals to provide safe and appropriate outcomes.

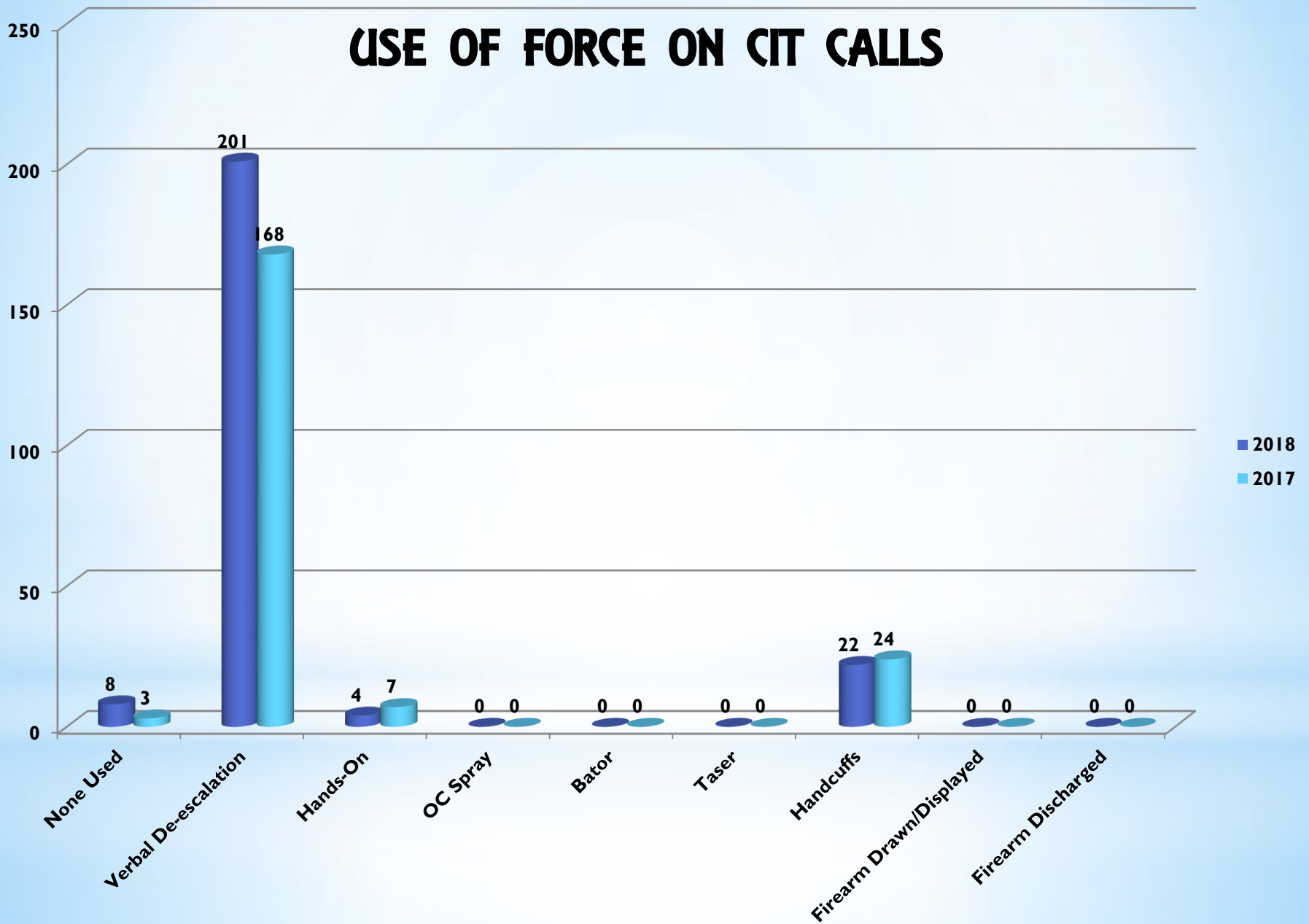
CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM CALLS BY TYPE



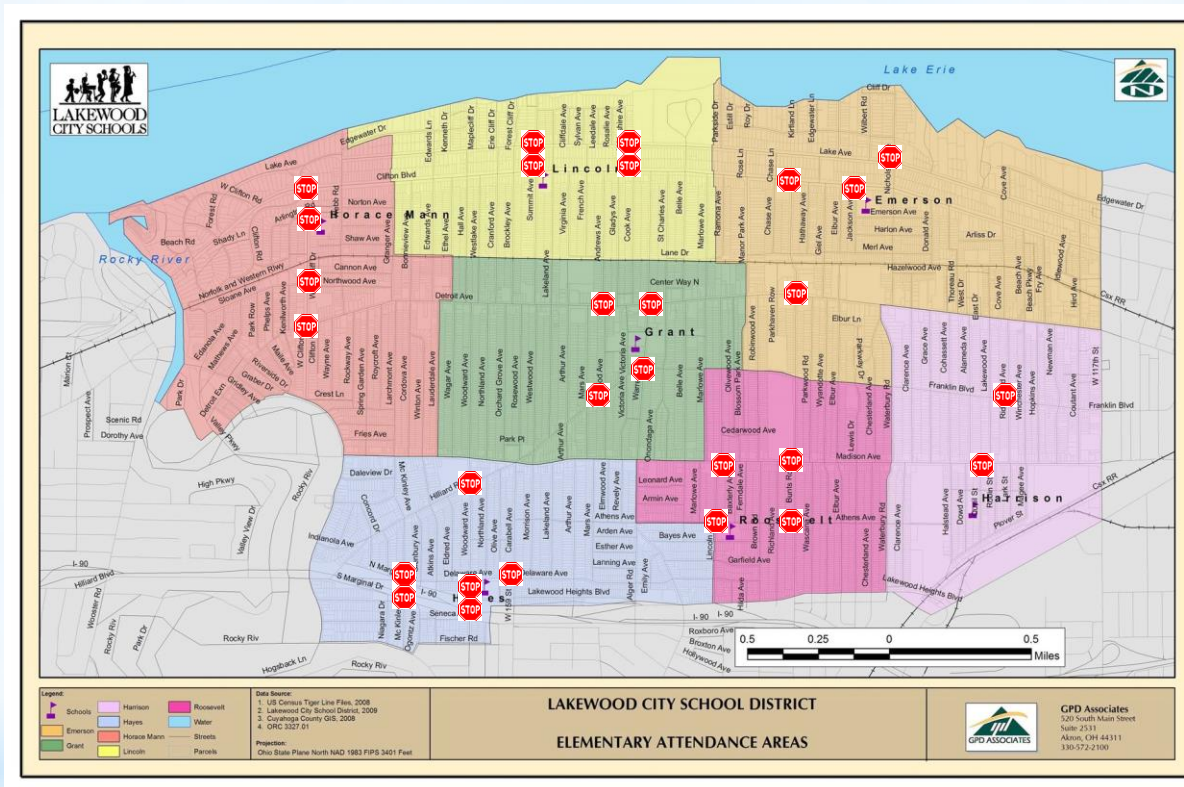
DISPOSITION OF CALL

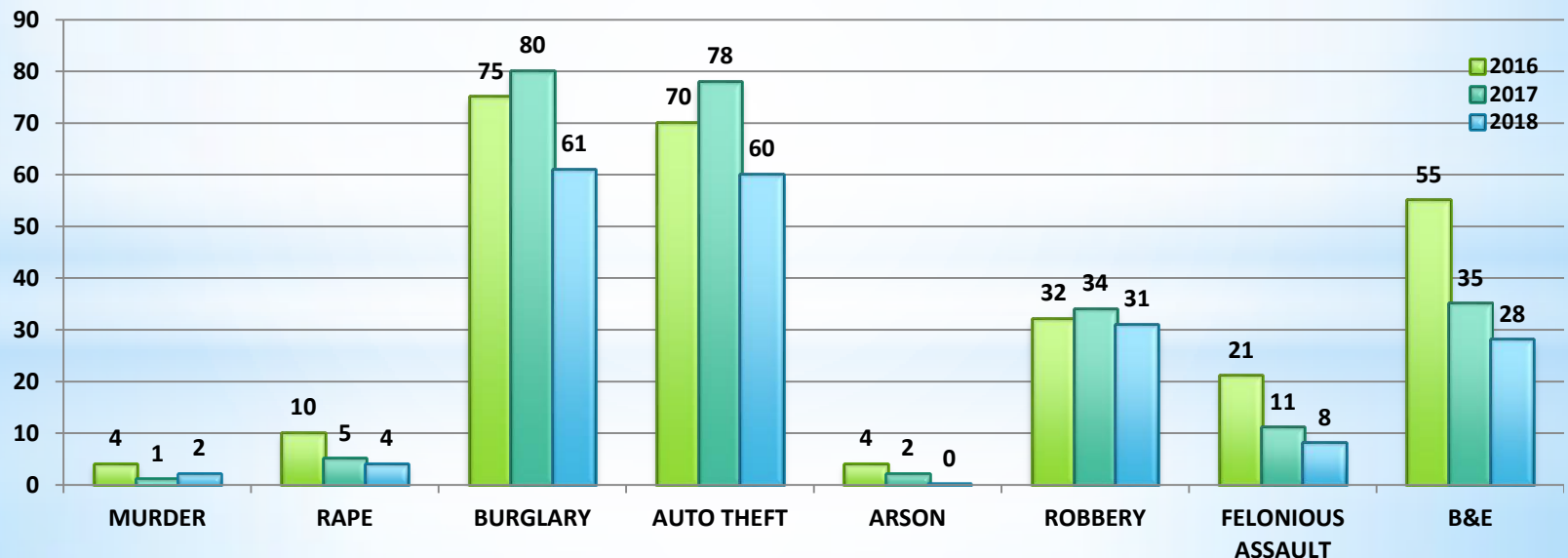

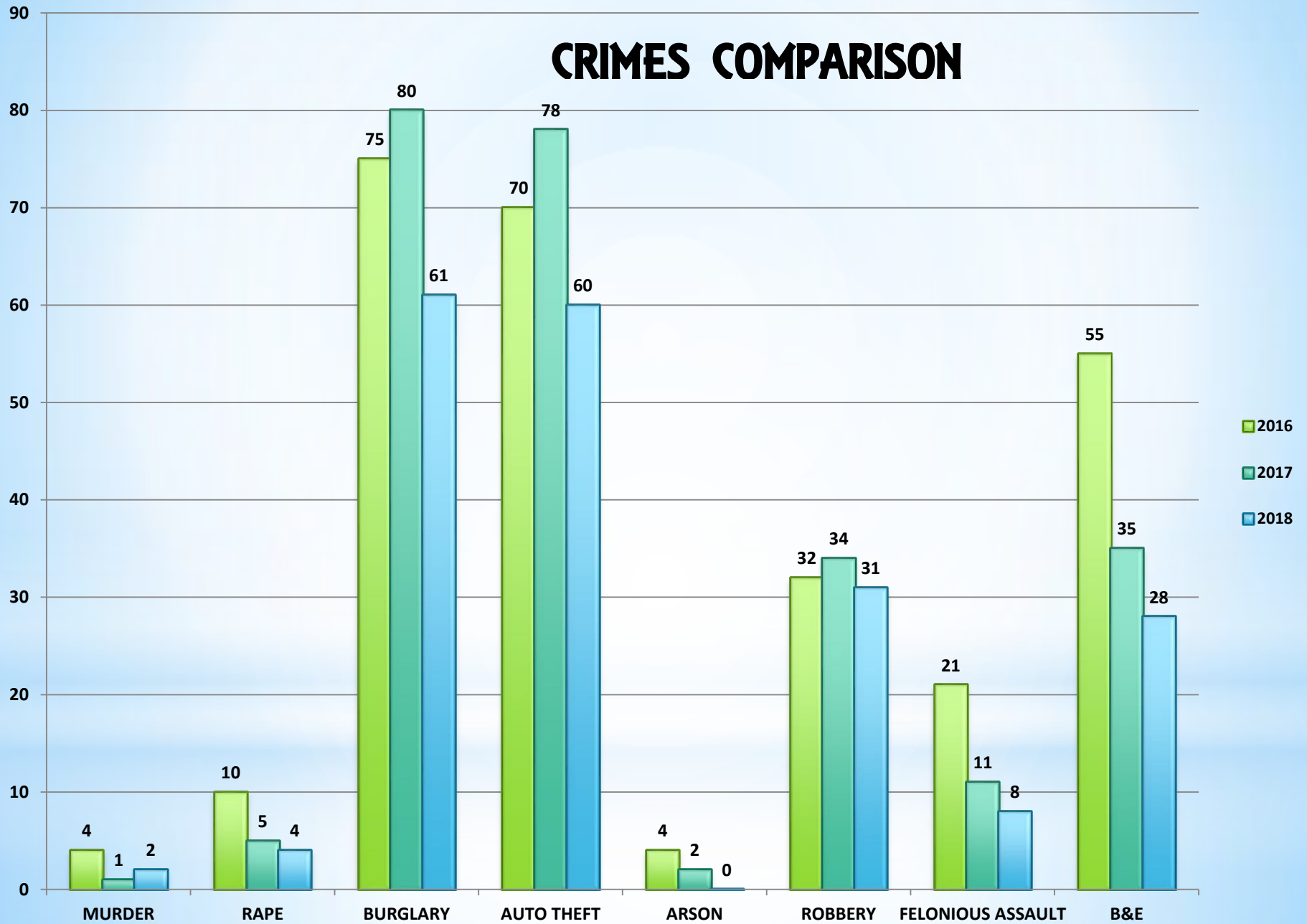

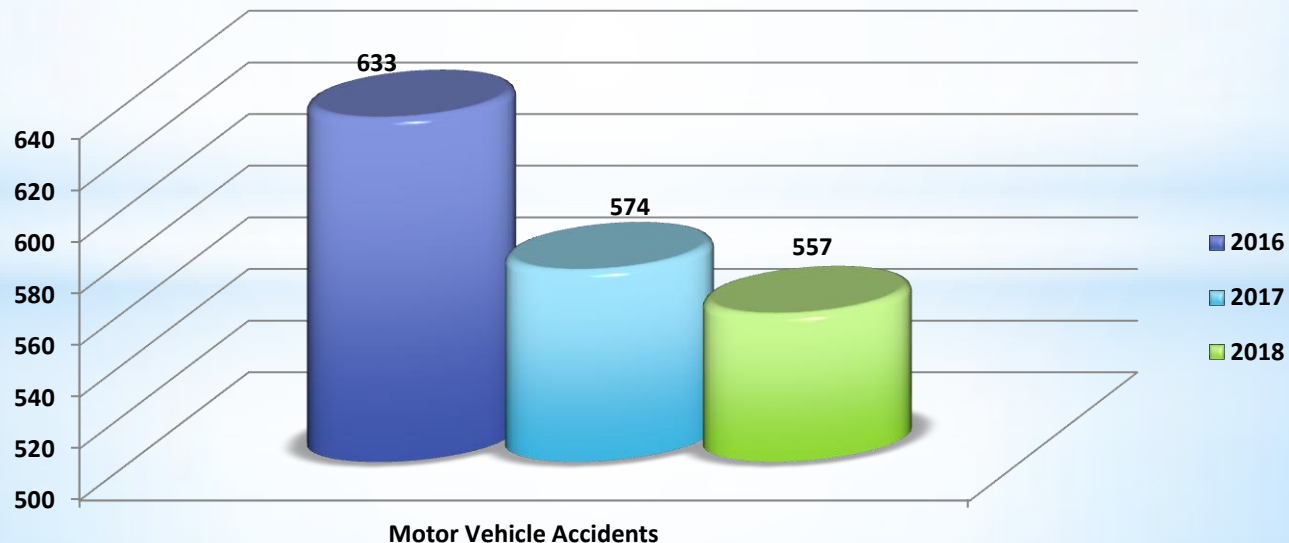


CRIMES COMPARISON

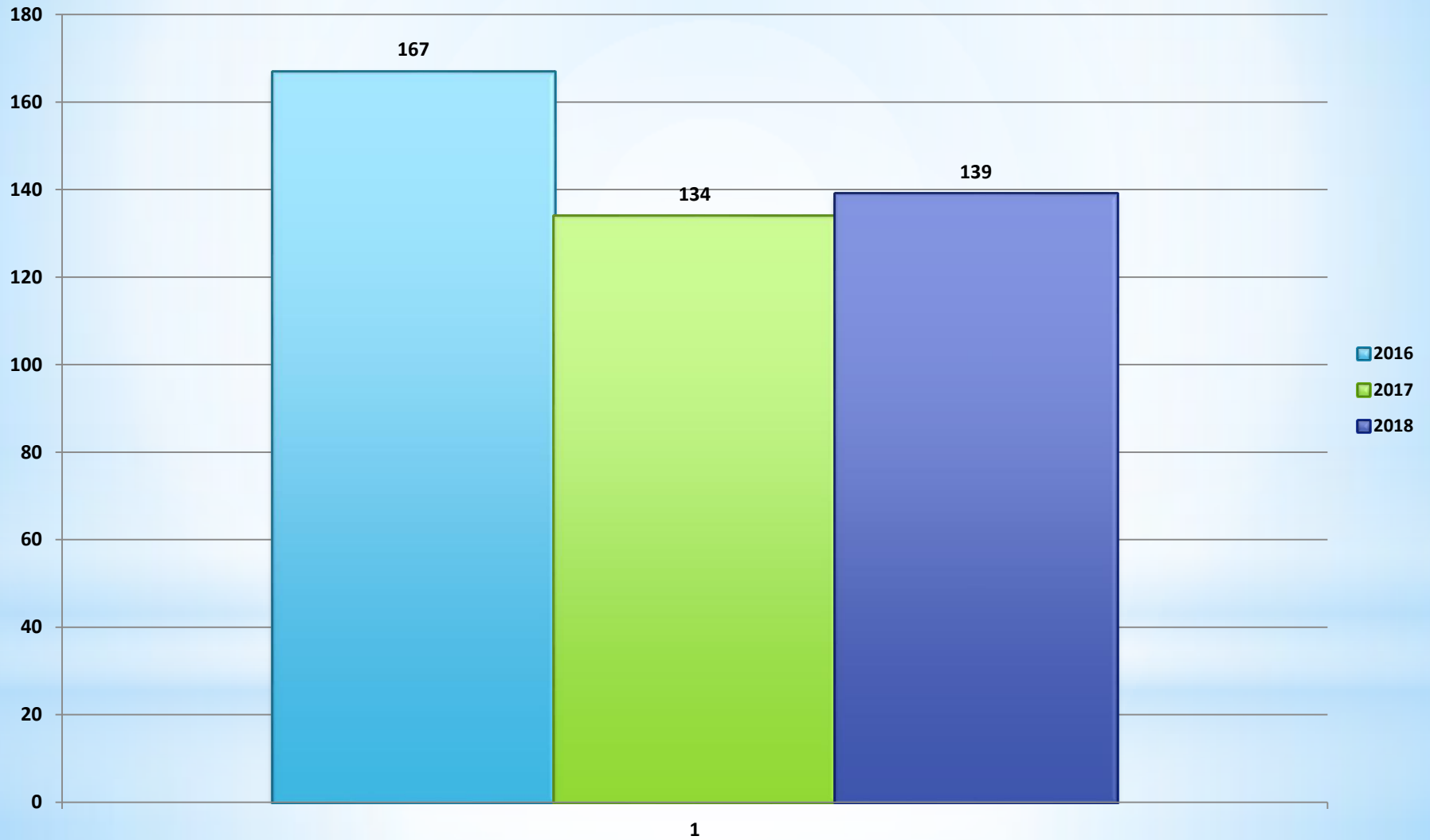


ARREST STATISTICS

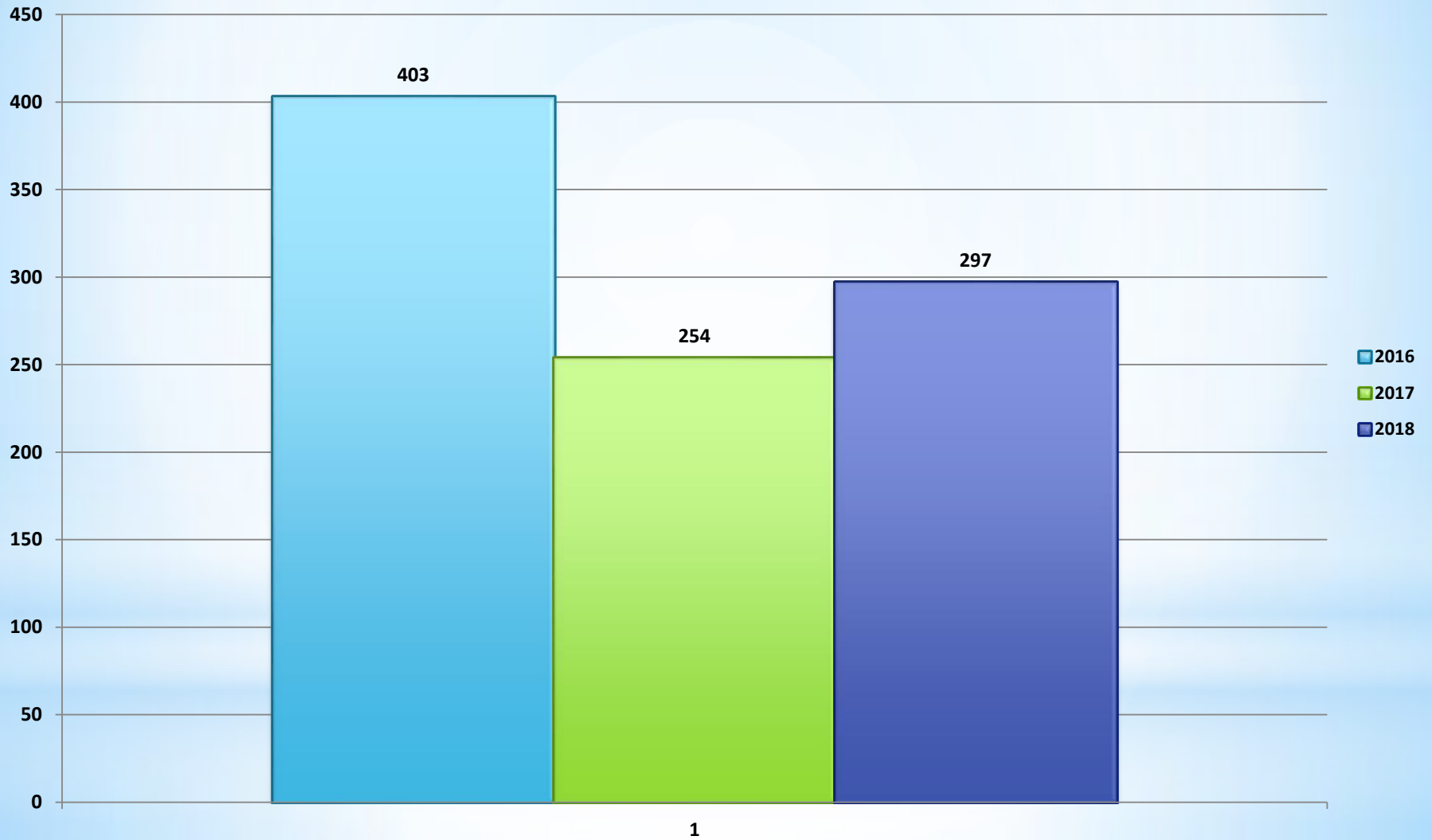

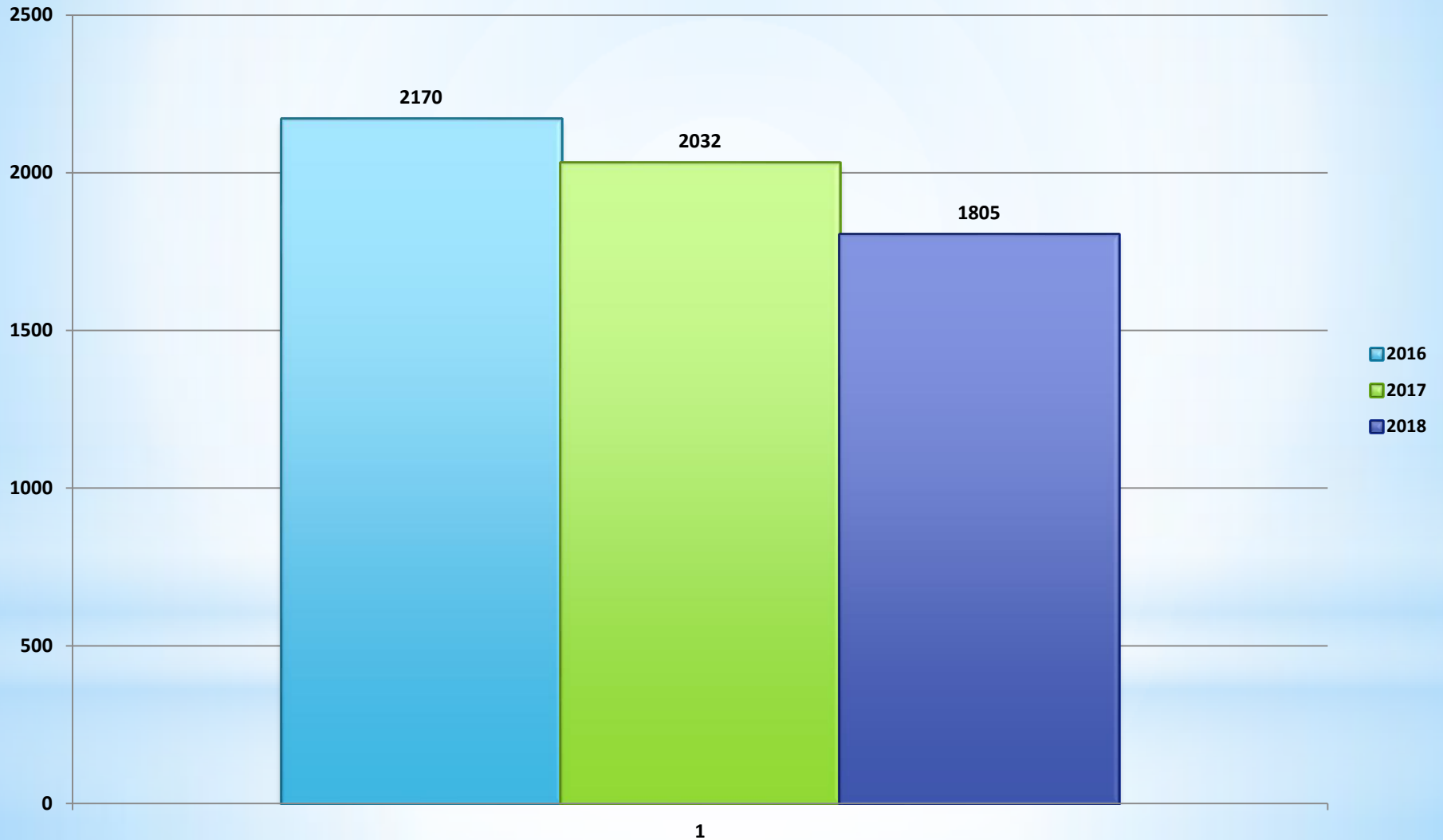
3 YEAR DUI ARRESTS



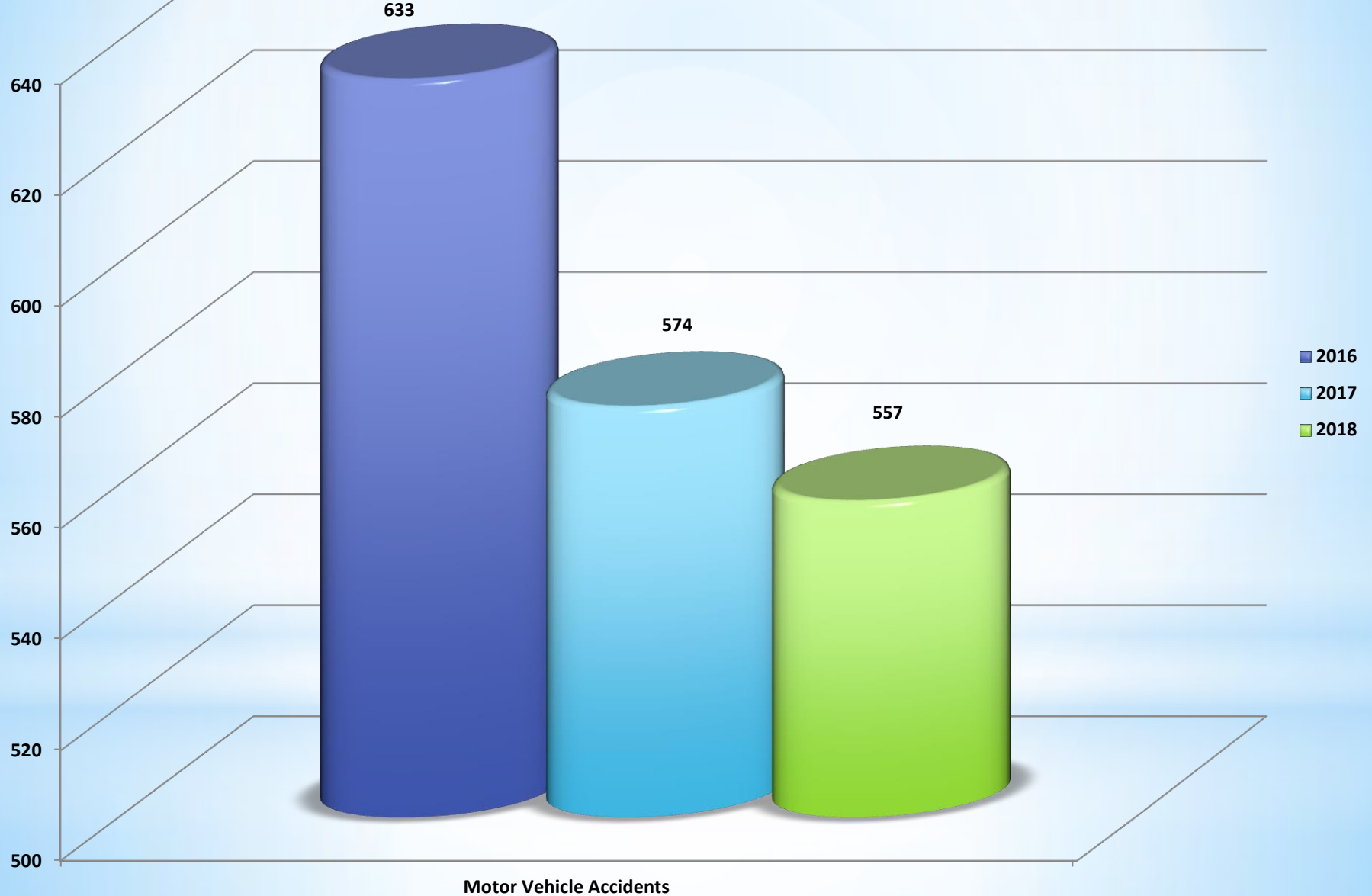
3 YEAR FELONY ARRESTS



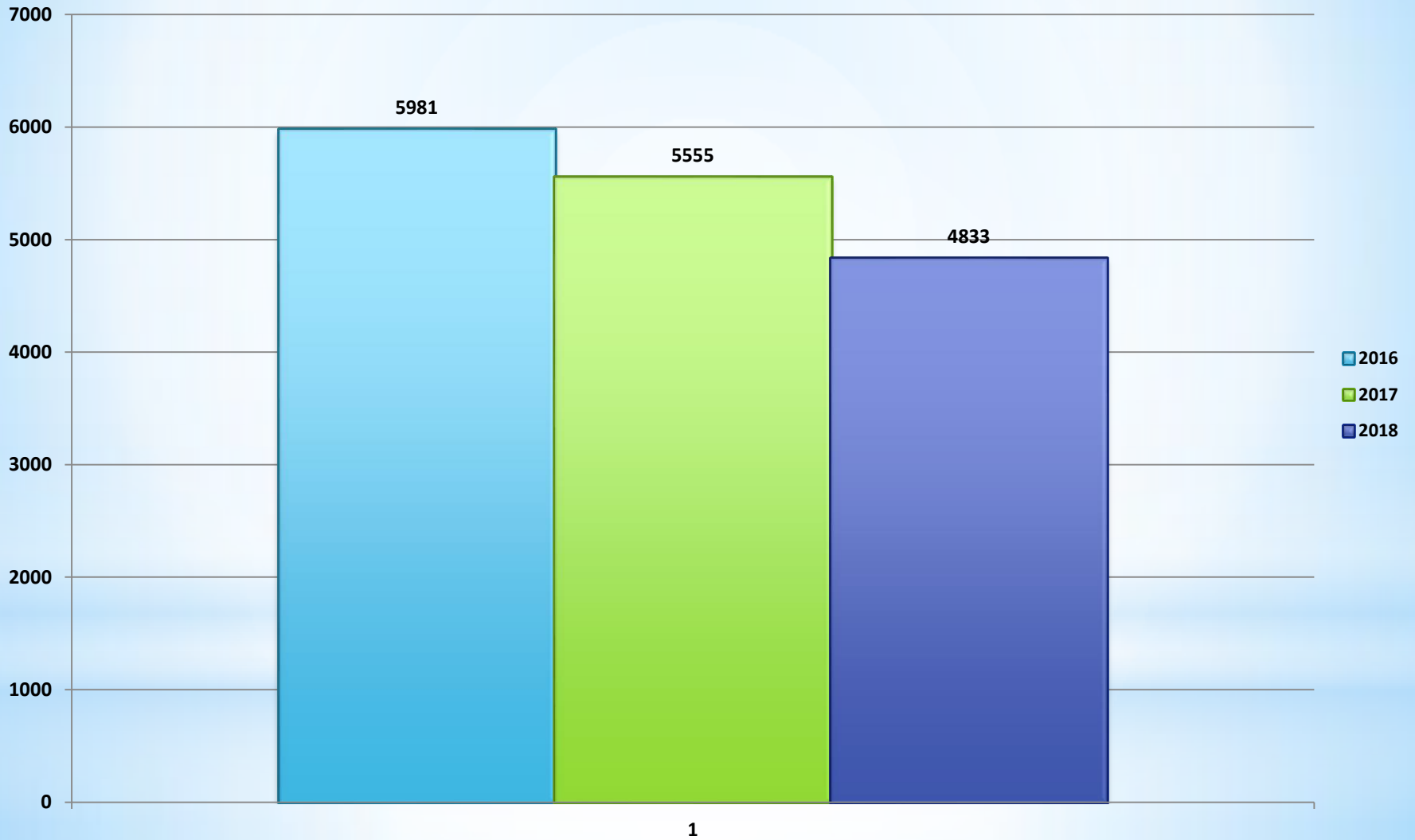
3 YEAR MISDEMEANOR ARRESTS



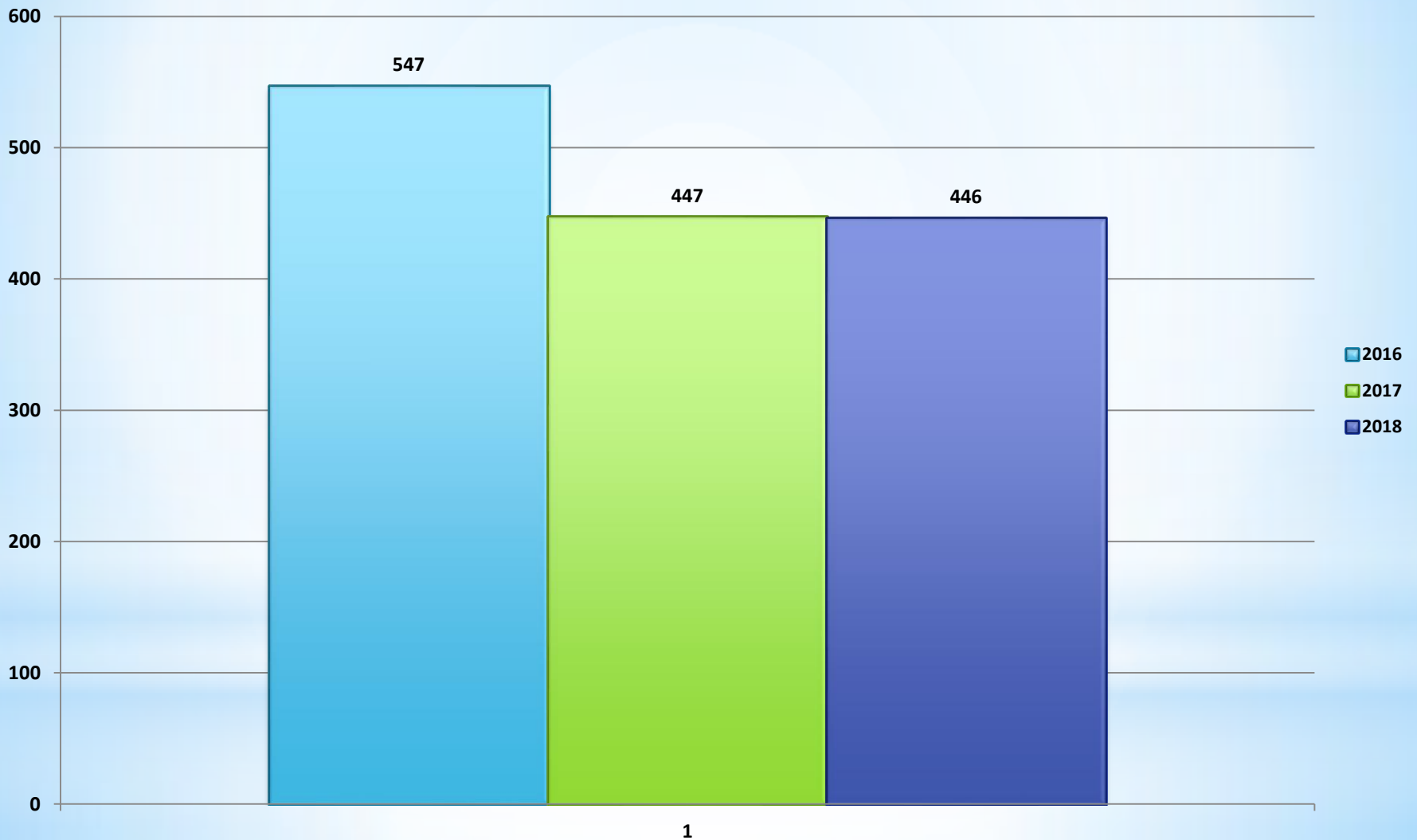
ACCIDENTS 3 YEAR COMPARISON



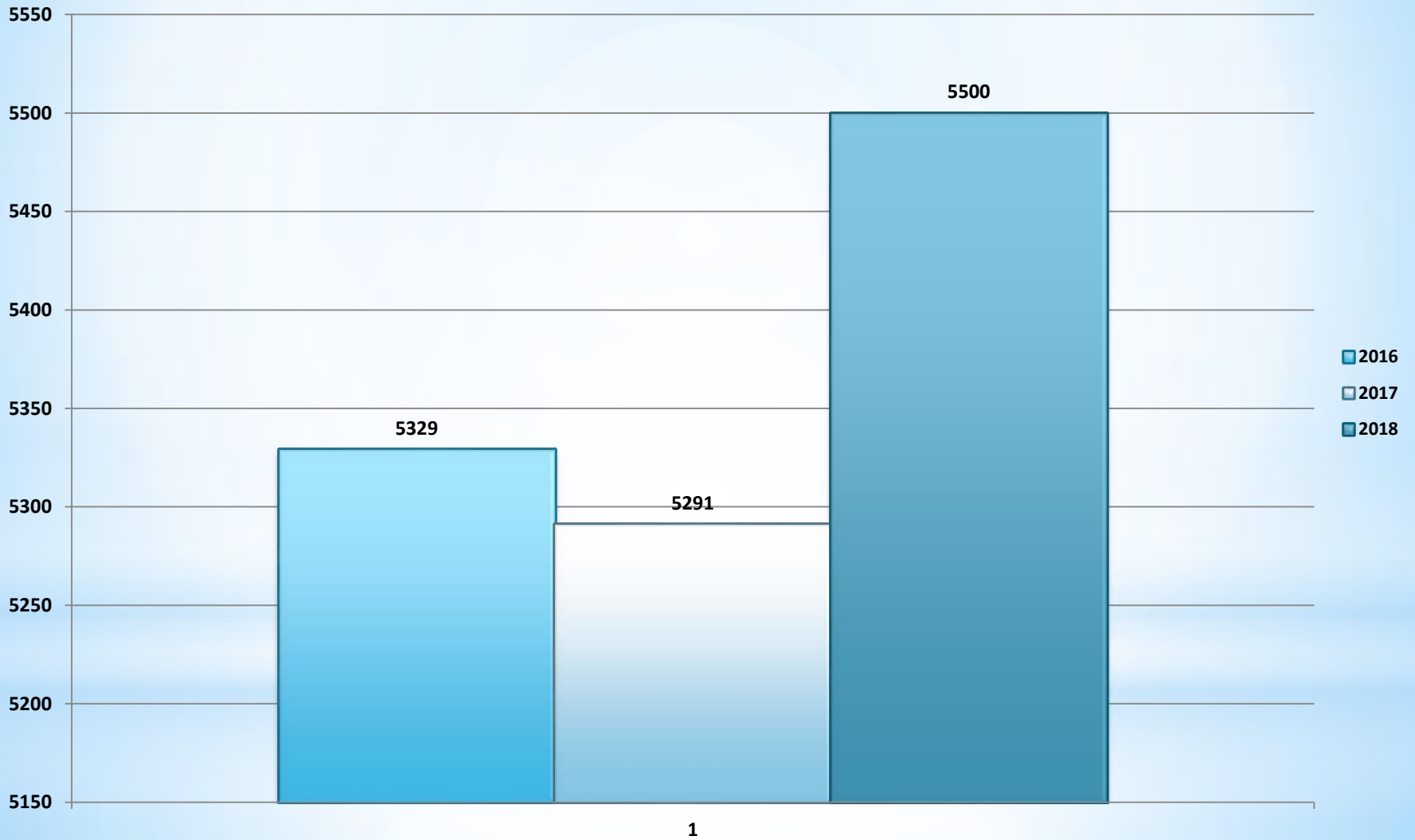
3 YEAR TRAFFIC ARRESTS TOTALS

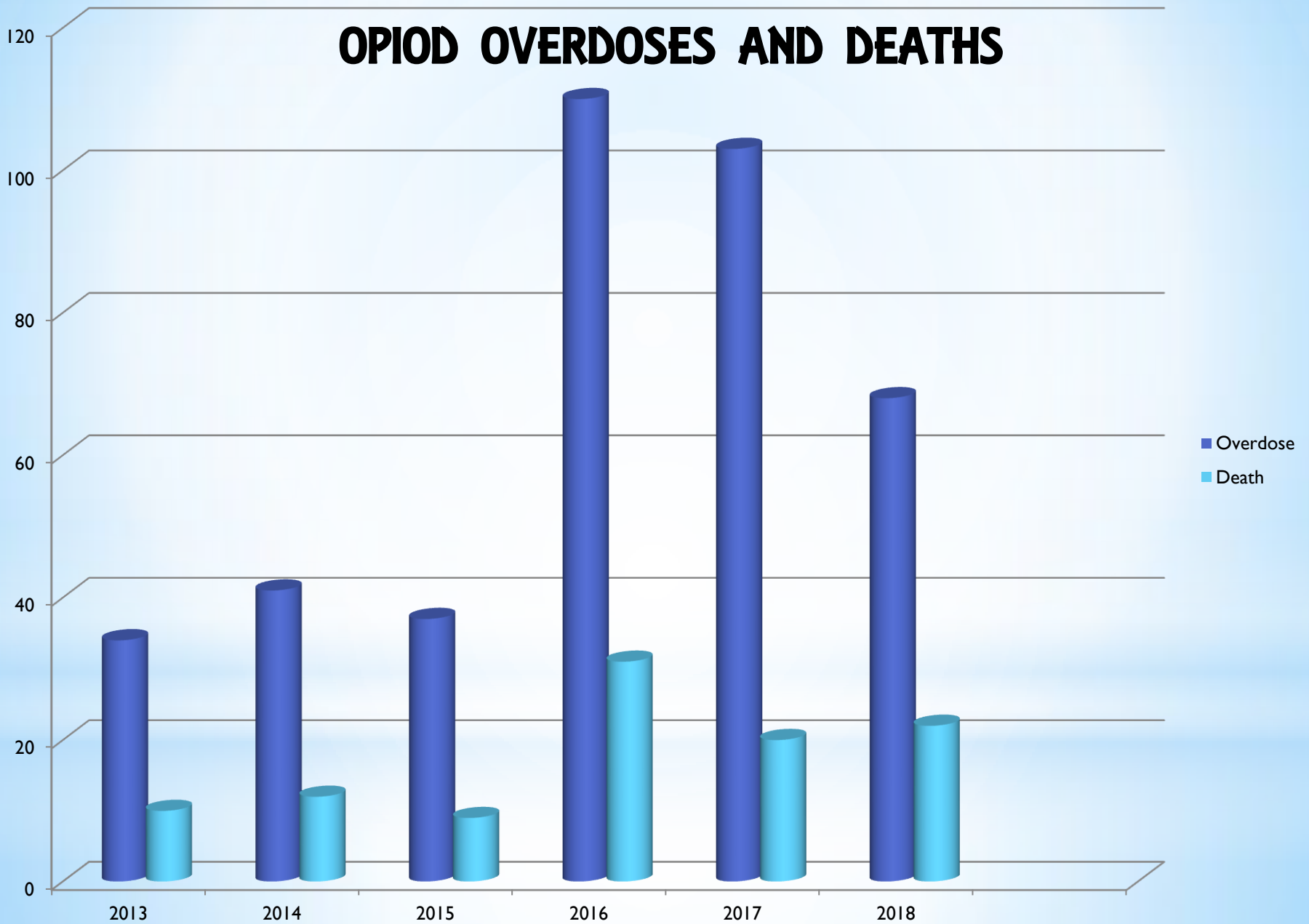

Narcotics Crimes



The Lakewood Police Department has One Lieutenant and Four Detectives assigned to Narcotics Investigations. We have maintained strong liaisons with Federal, State, and County partners to investigate and prosecute narcotics related violations. The City of Lakewood continues to have high incidences of heroin overdoses and deaths, which have been a problem throughout our region. All of our officers have been issued the life saving drug Narcan, to administer to those that have overdosed to identify and prosecute those that are responsible for supplying the drugs.

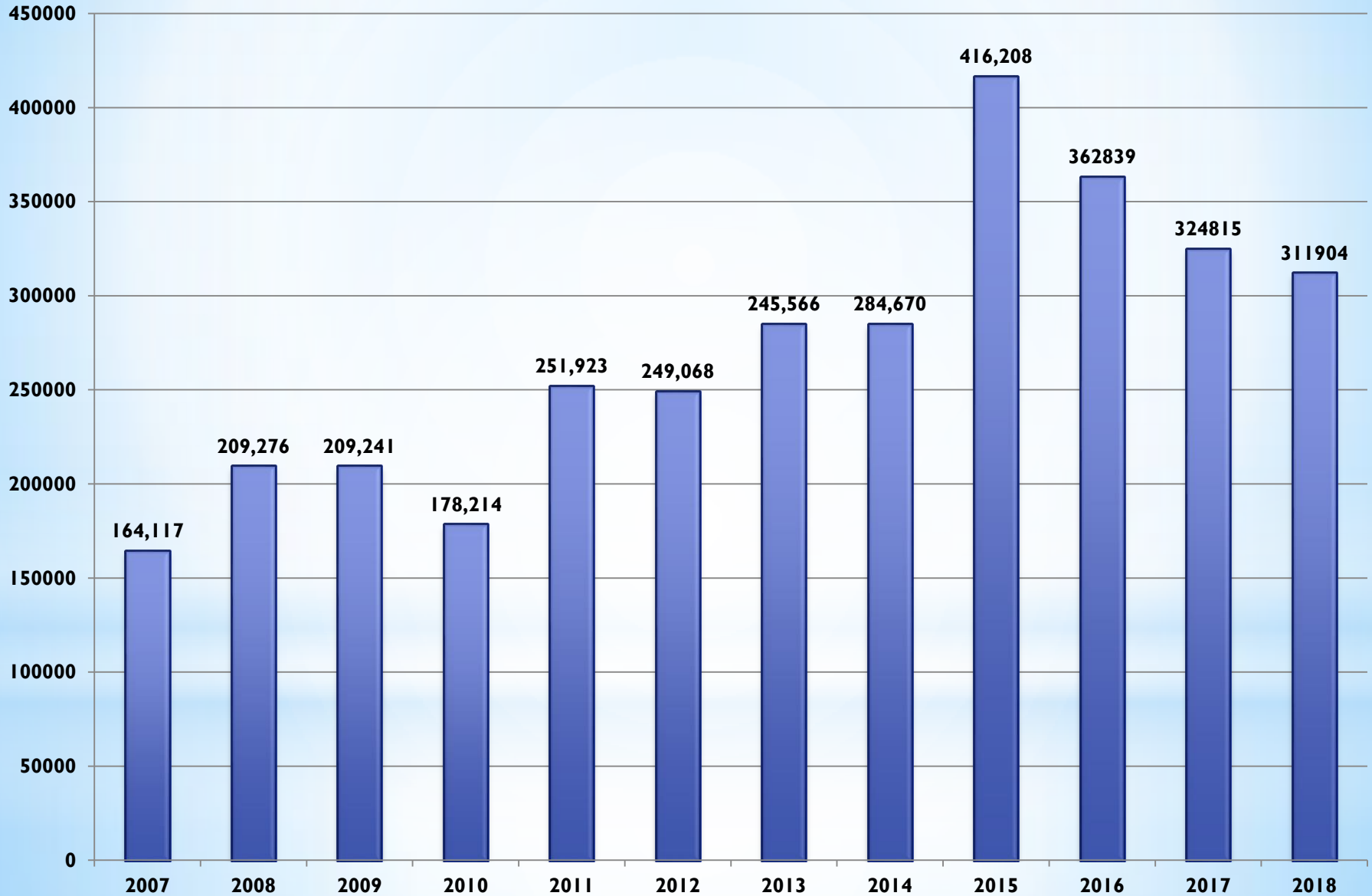


Parking Enforcement

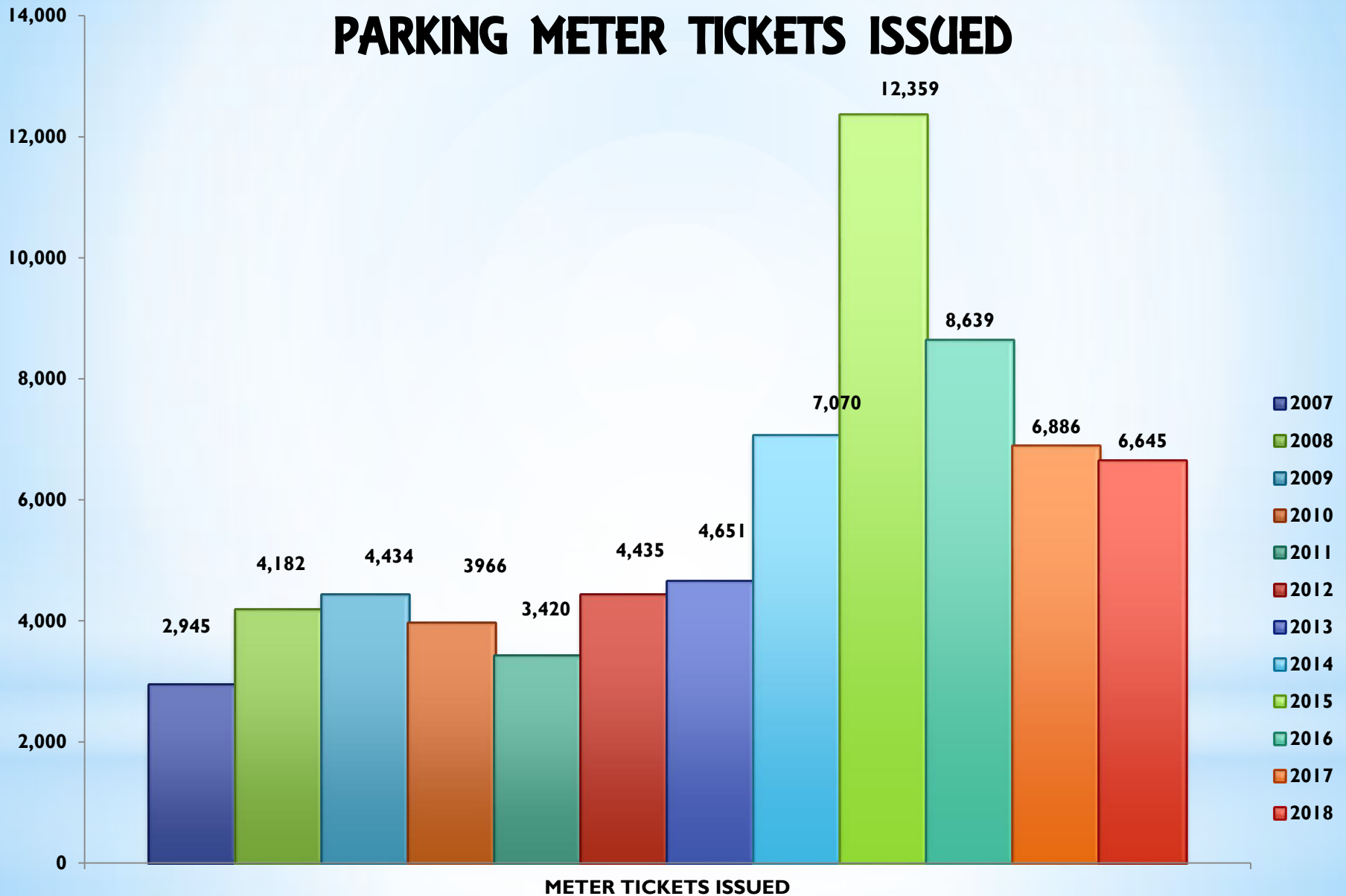
The Parking Enforcement Officers are responsible for the operation and maintenance of our parking meters and kiosks, as well as enforcement of meter violations and other parking infractions. The monies collected from our parking lots make the unit self sufficient as it pays for personnel, equipment, and improvements. The funds collected from non meter tickets is deposited into the general fund. Monitoring the turnover of vehicles in our lots contributes to the vibrancy of our commercial districts.



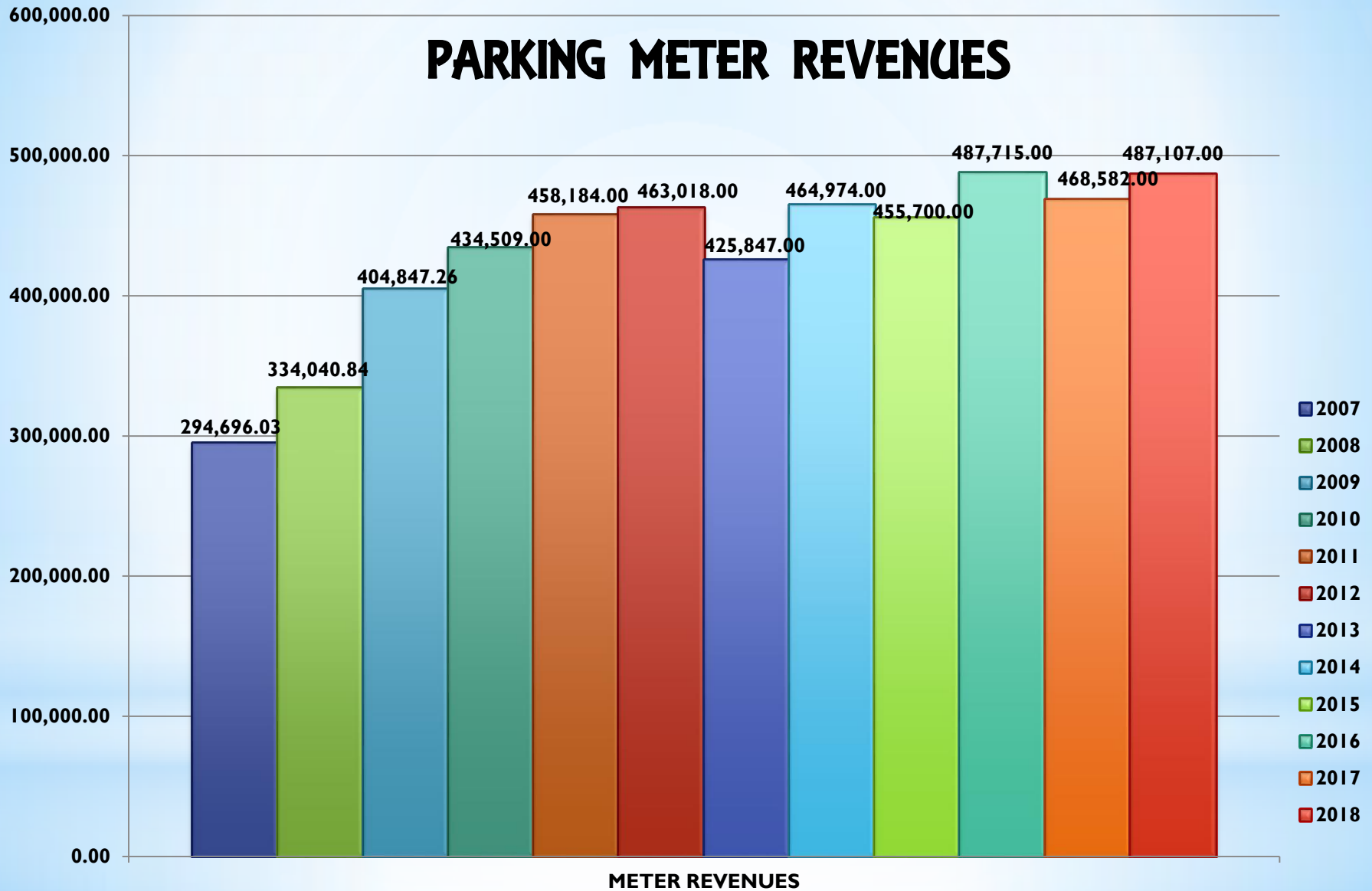
PARKING CITATION REVENUE

PARKING METER REVENUES

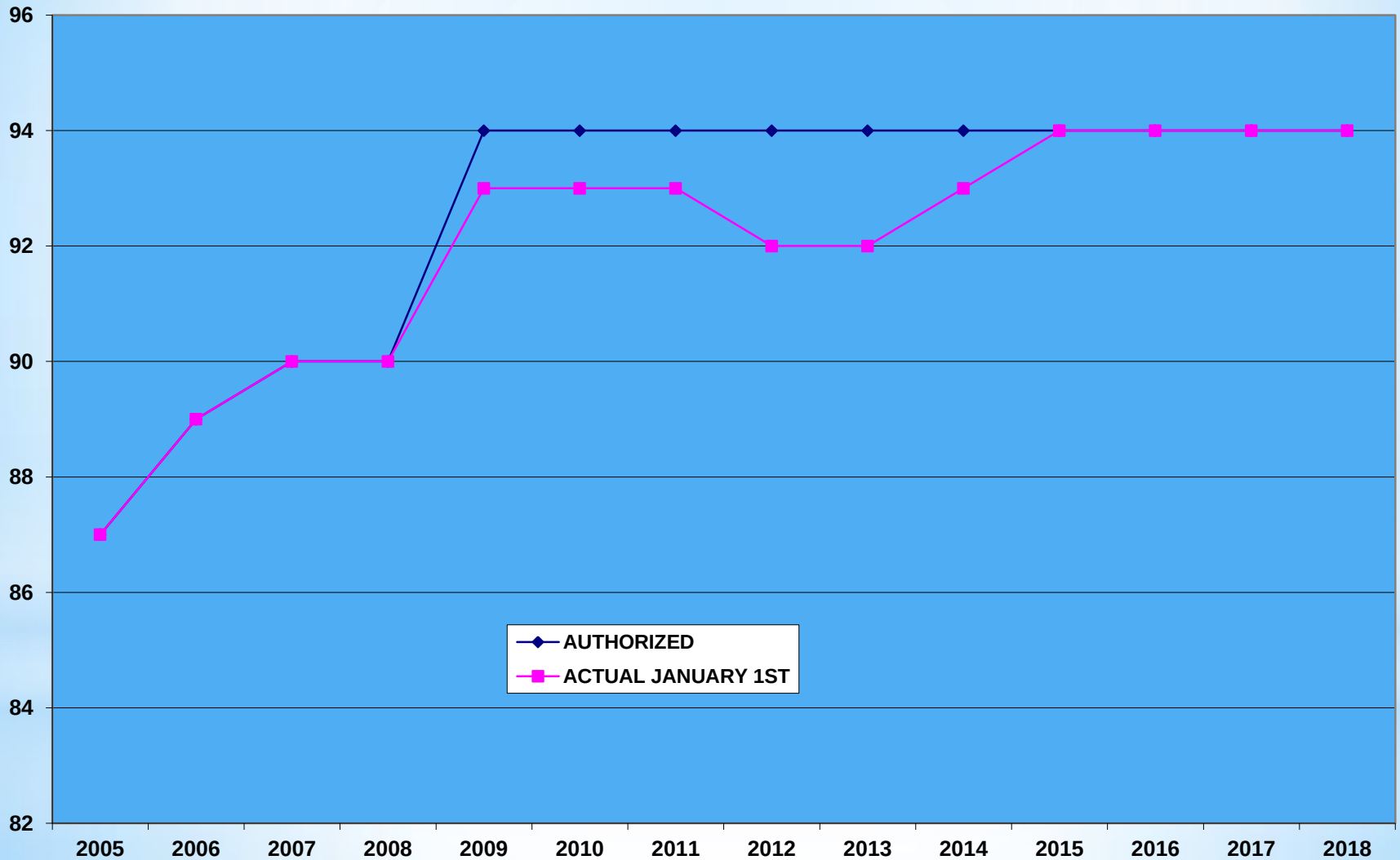


LAKEWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL AND COSTS

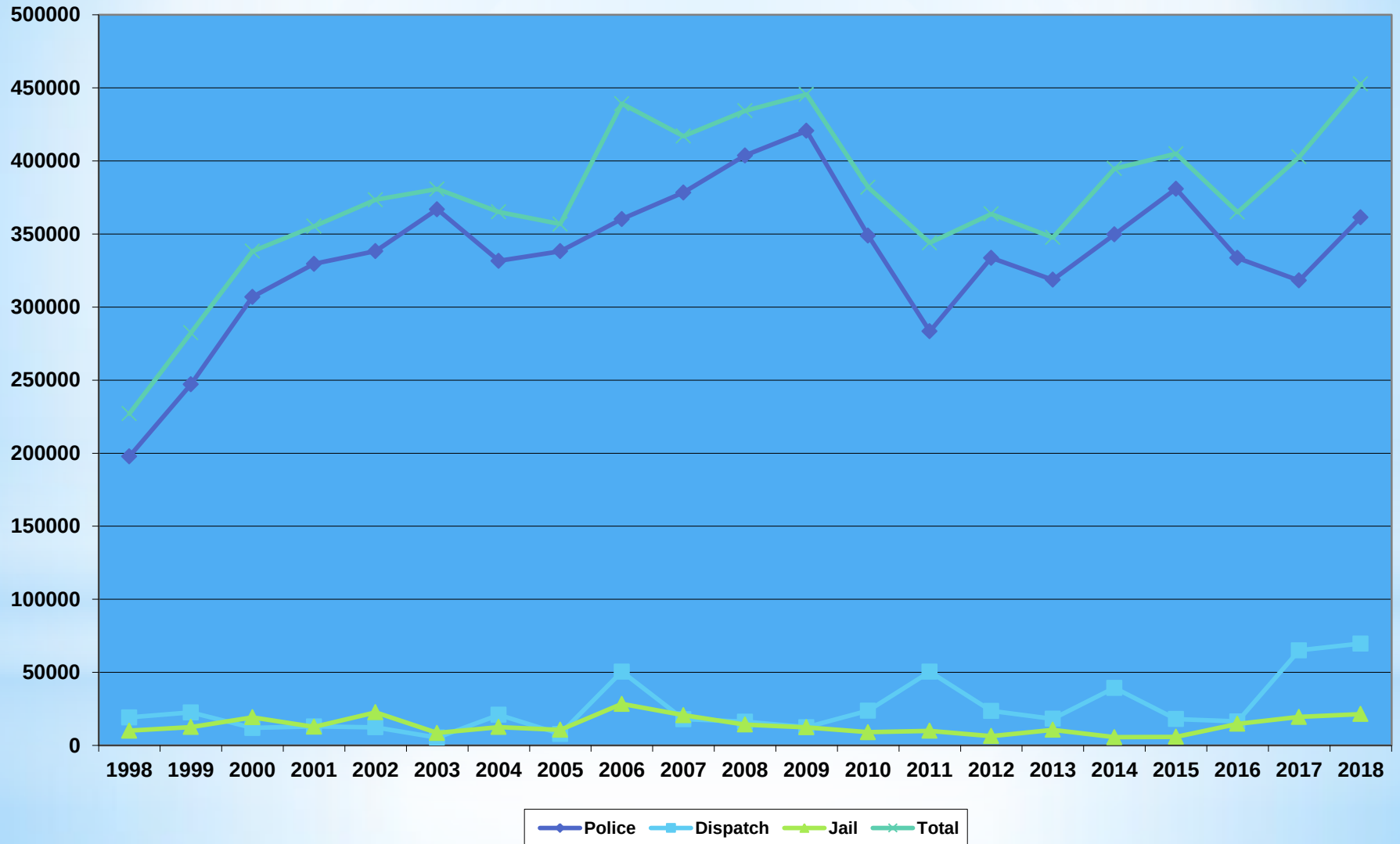
The Lakewood Police Department has a total of 99 sworn officers, 20 full time civilian employees and 33 part time civilian employees. The civilian employees include our Dispatchers, Corrections Officers, Administrative Clerks, School Guards, Cleaning Staff, and Property/Evidence Management.

TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL OVERTIME COSTS



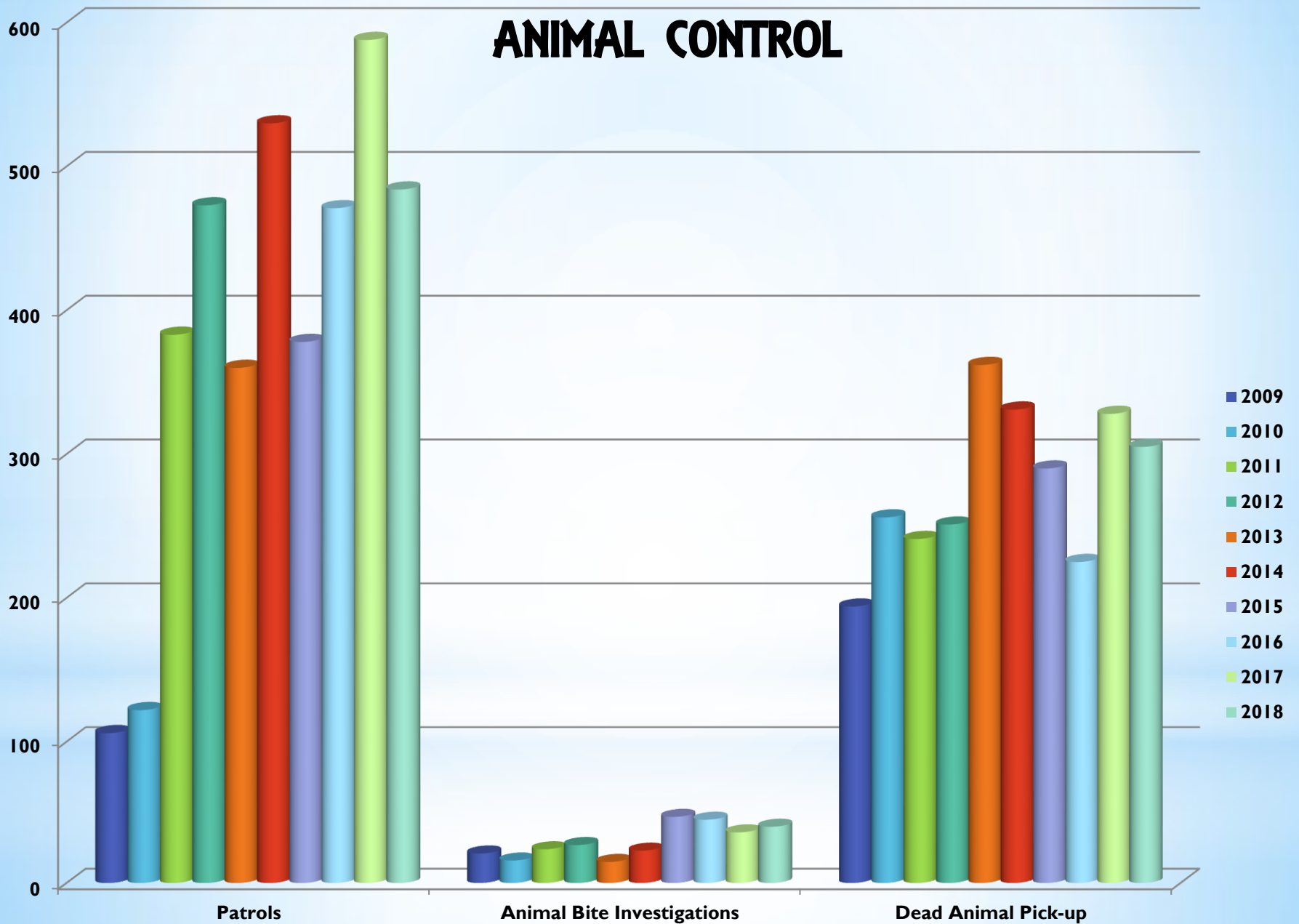
ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS



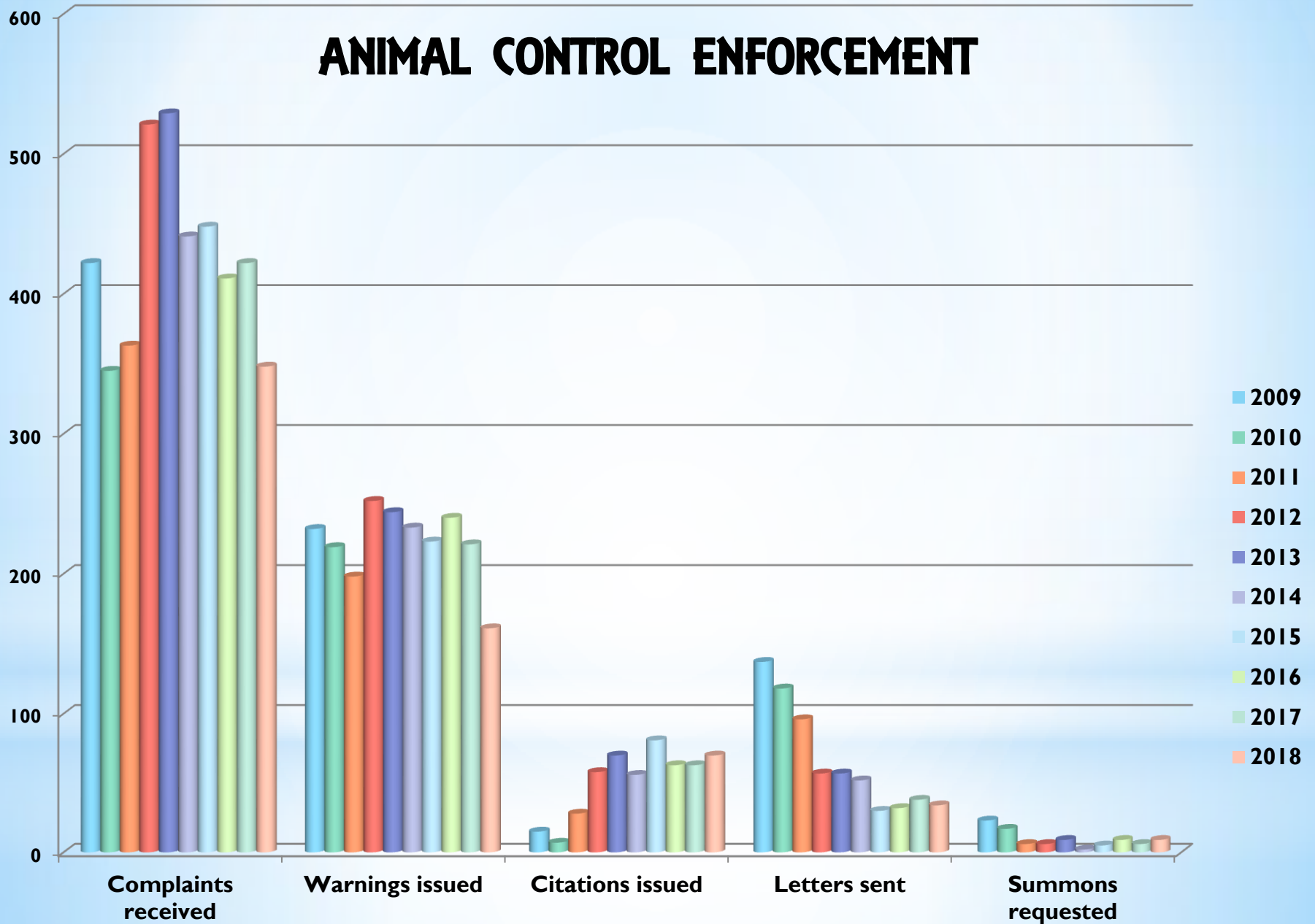

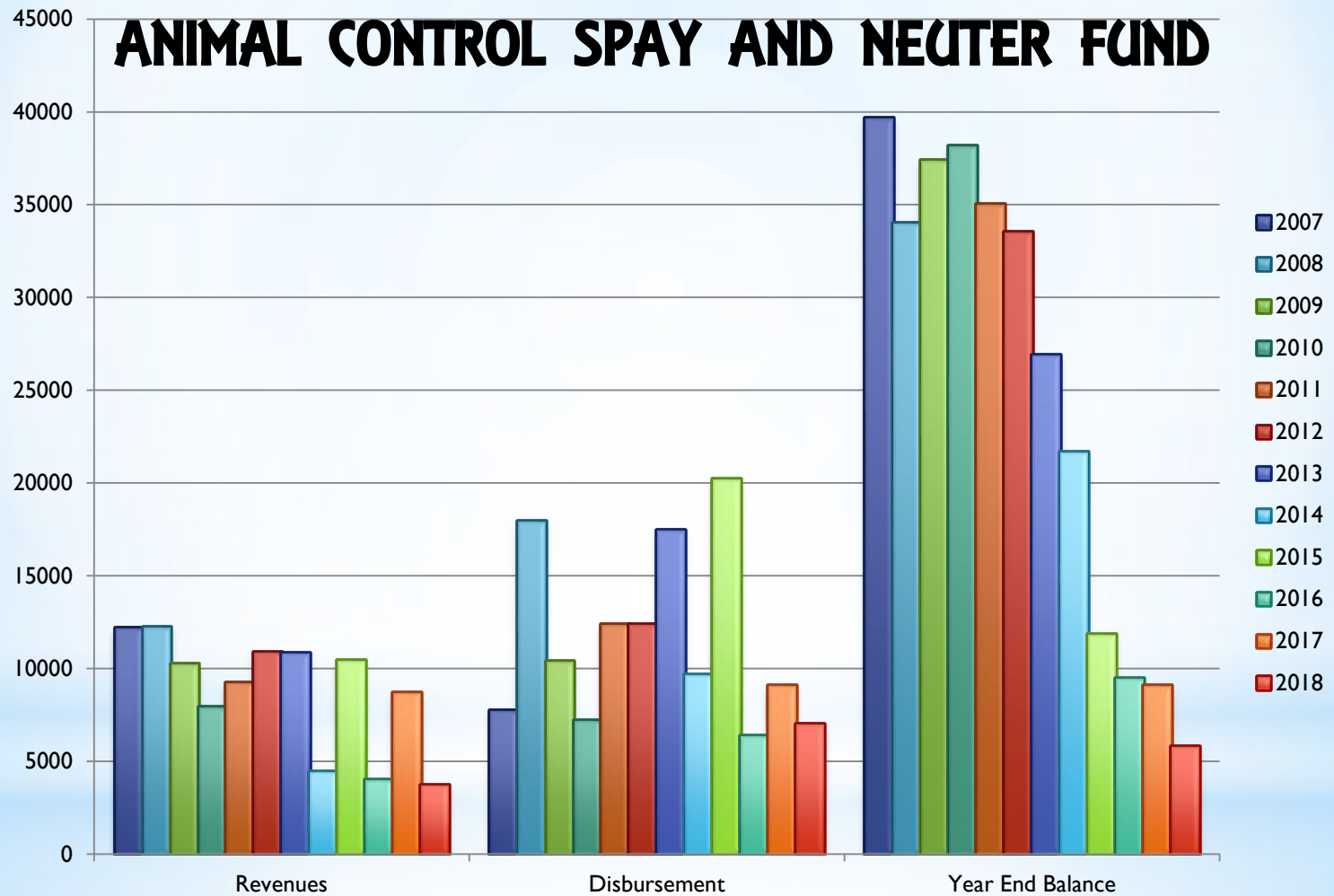

ANIMAL CONTROL SPAY AND NEUTER FUND

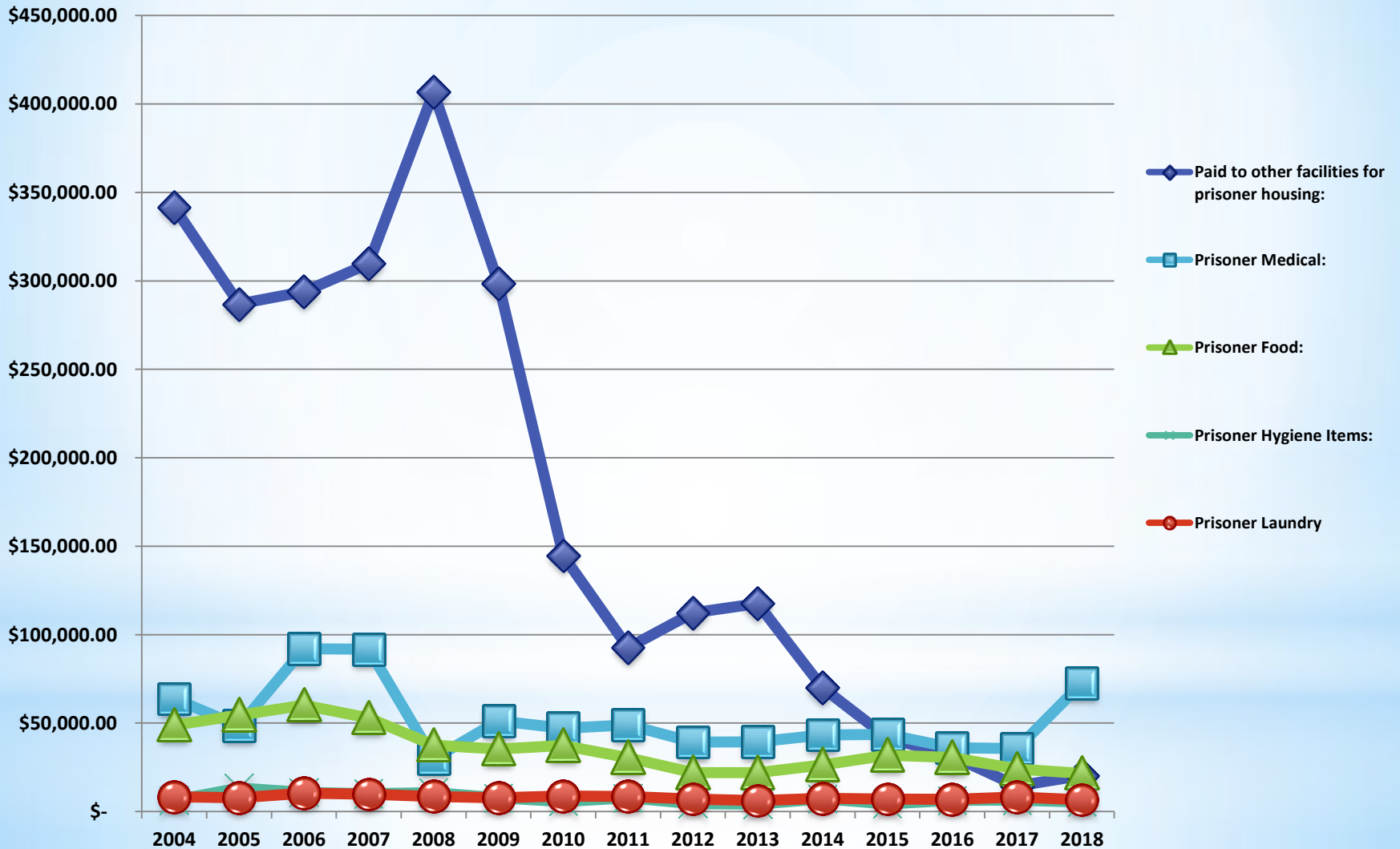


LAKEWOOD CITY JAIL

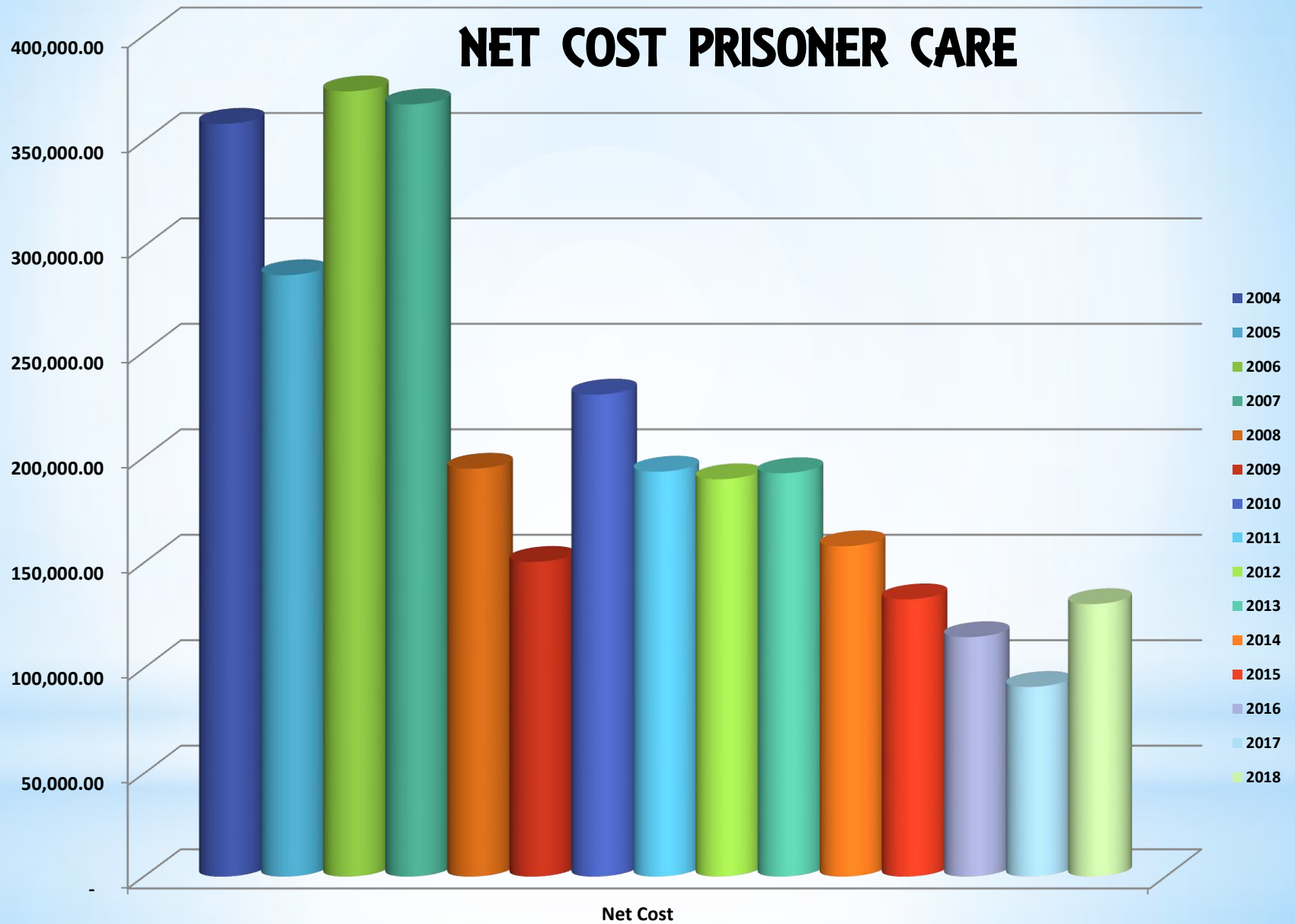
The Lakewood City Jail is currently staffed by two full time Corrections Officers and supplemented by sworn police officers. The capacity for the jail is set by the State of Ohio at 11 prisoners and is designated as a twelve day facility. The Lakewood Police Department endeavors to place prisoners in the appropriate long term facilities in order to reduce costs and remain in compliance with state standards.



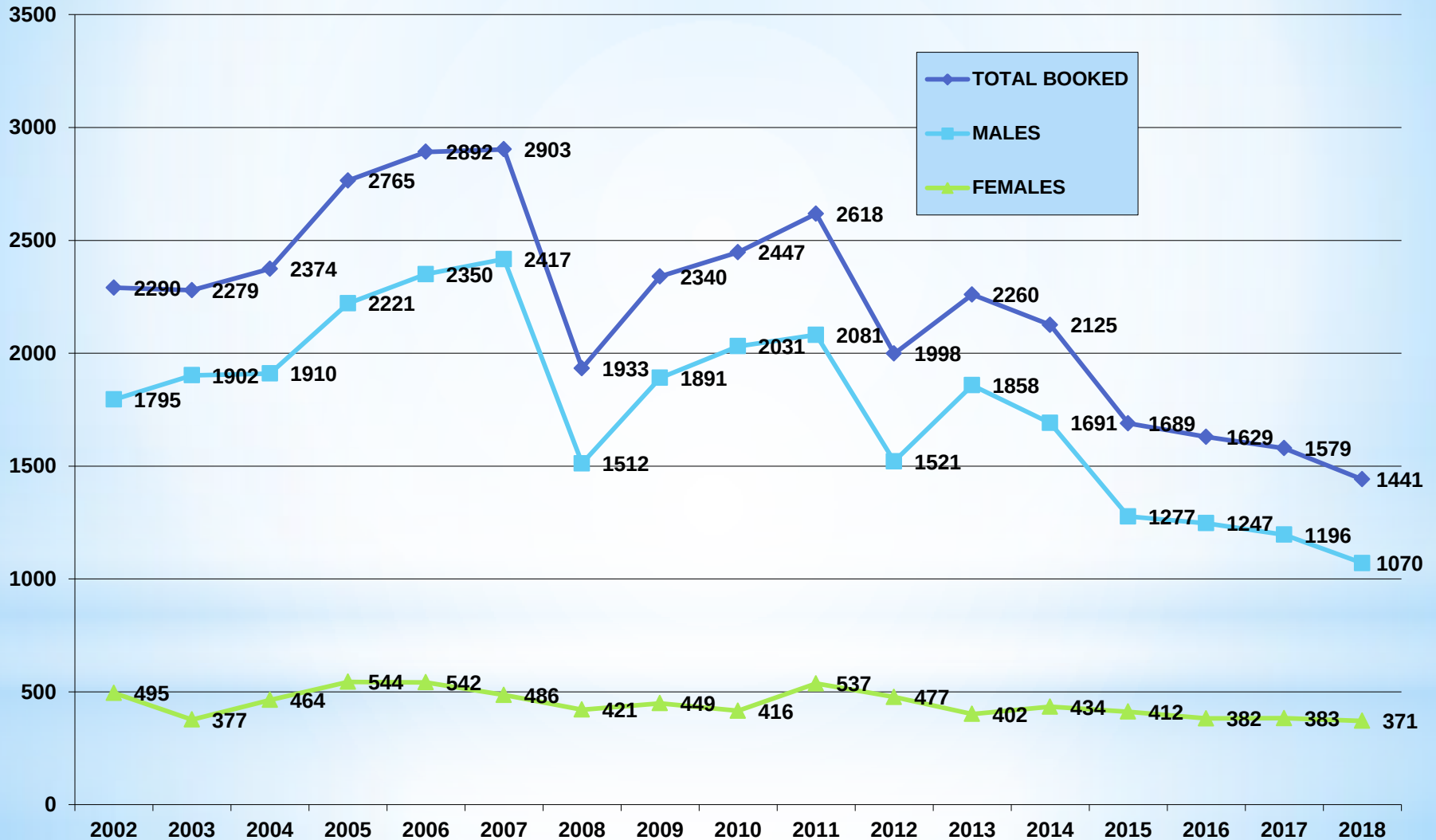
JAIL COSTS COMPARISON

Jail Population Comparison

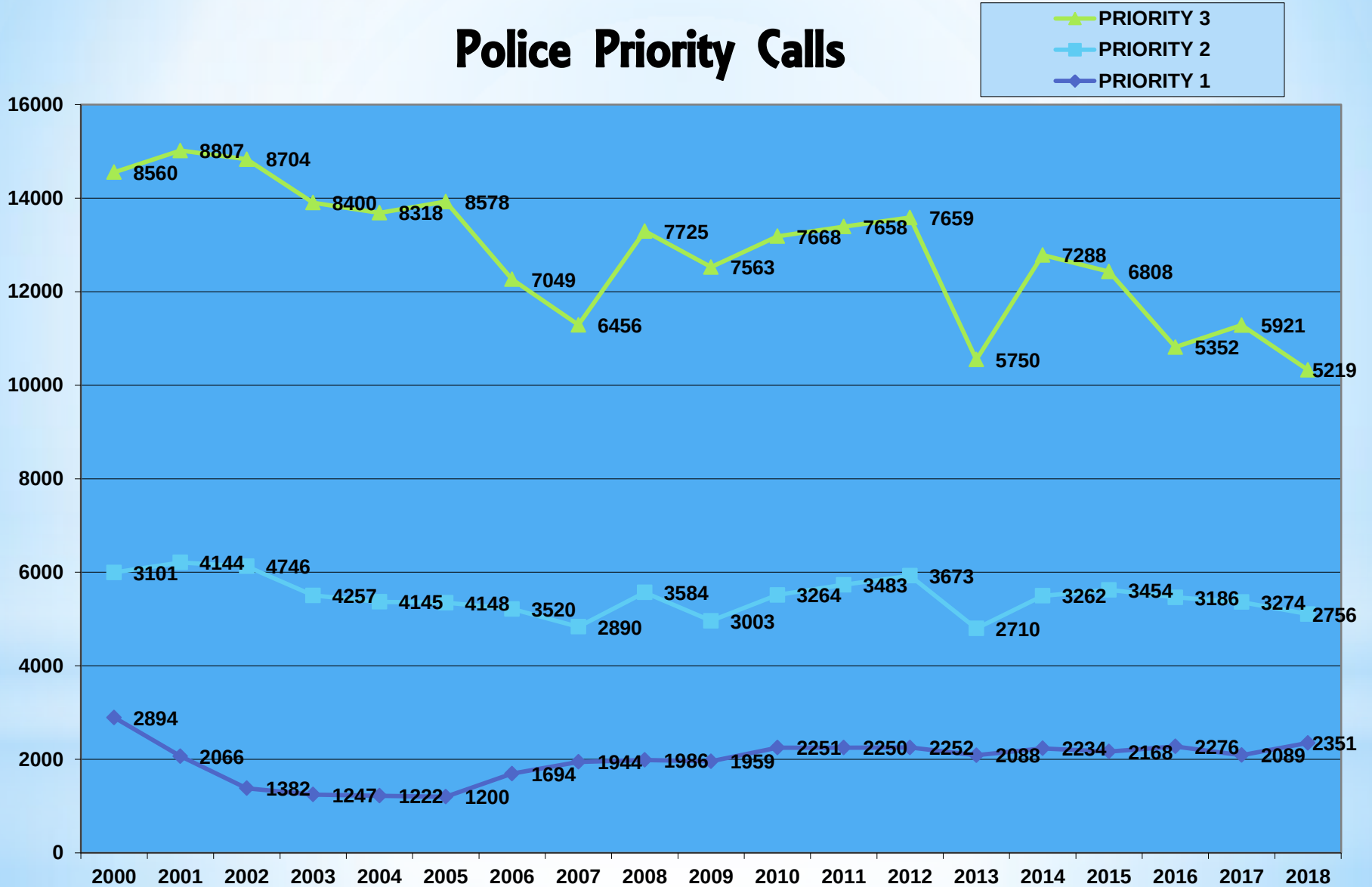


EMERGENCY DISPATCH

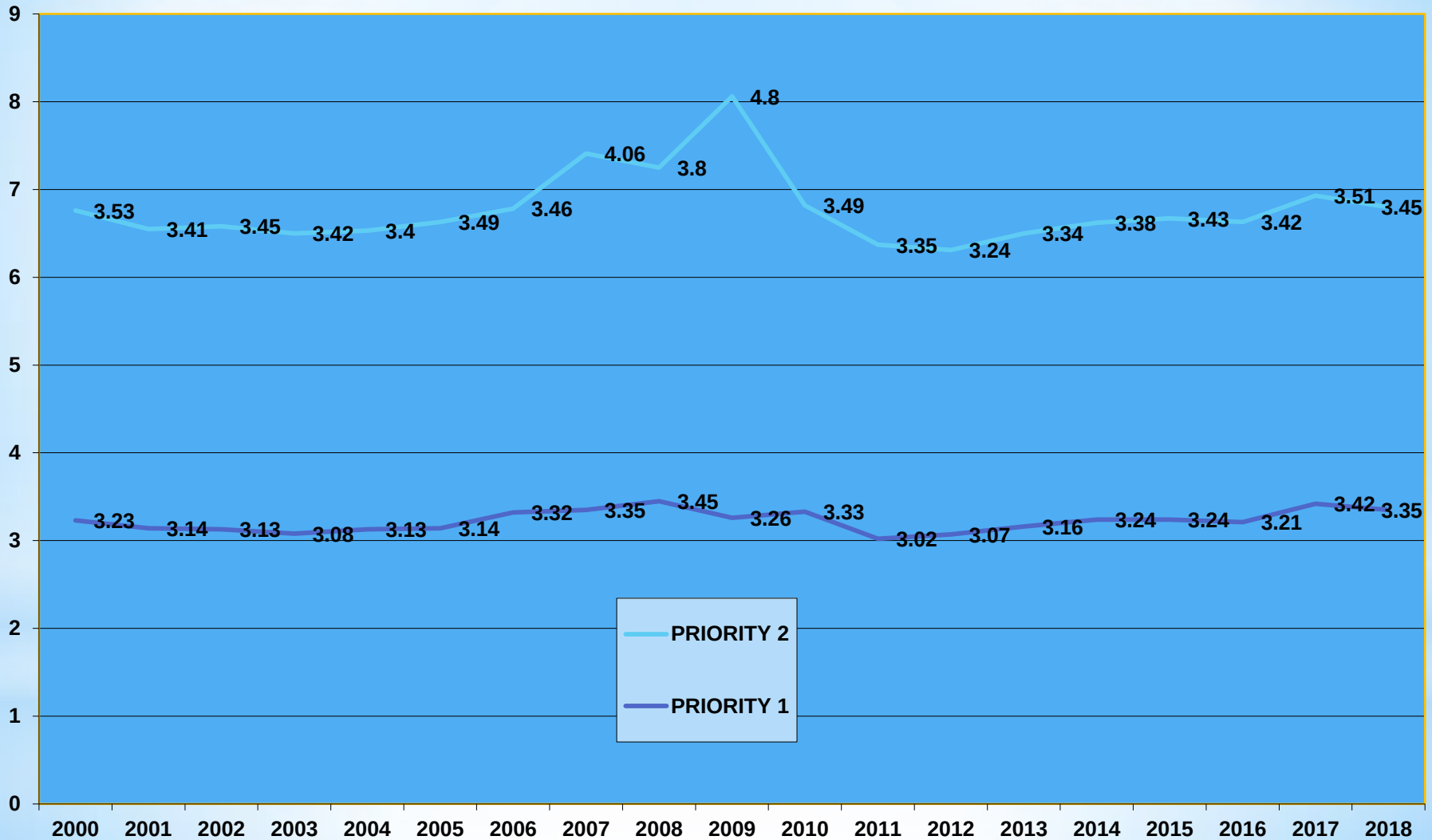


The Lakewood Police Department staffs eleven Dispatchers, who dispatch for Lakewood Police, Fire, and EMS. The Dispatchers serve as the critical first contact with citizens requiring safety services. The Dispatchers handled over 44,000 public safety calls and assignments to the Divisions. The Lakewood Police Department averaged 3.35 minutes from the time the Dispatcher sends a patrol car to the arrival on the scene, for Priority I calls, which are crimes in progress and life and death calls. All of our dispatchers are also trained in emergency medical dispatch which allows them to give life saving instructions to citizens prior to the safety forces arrival.

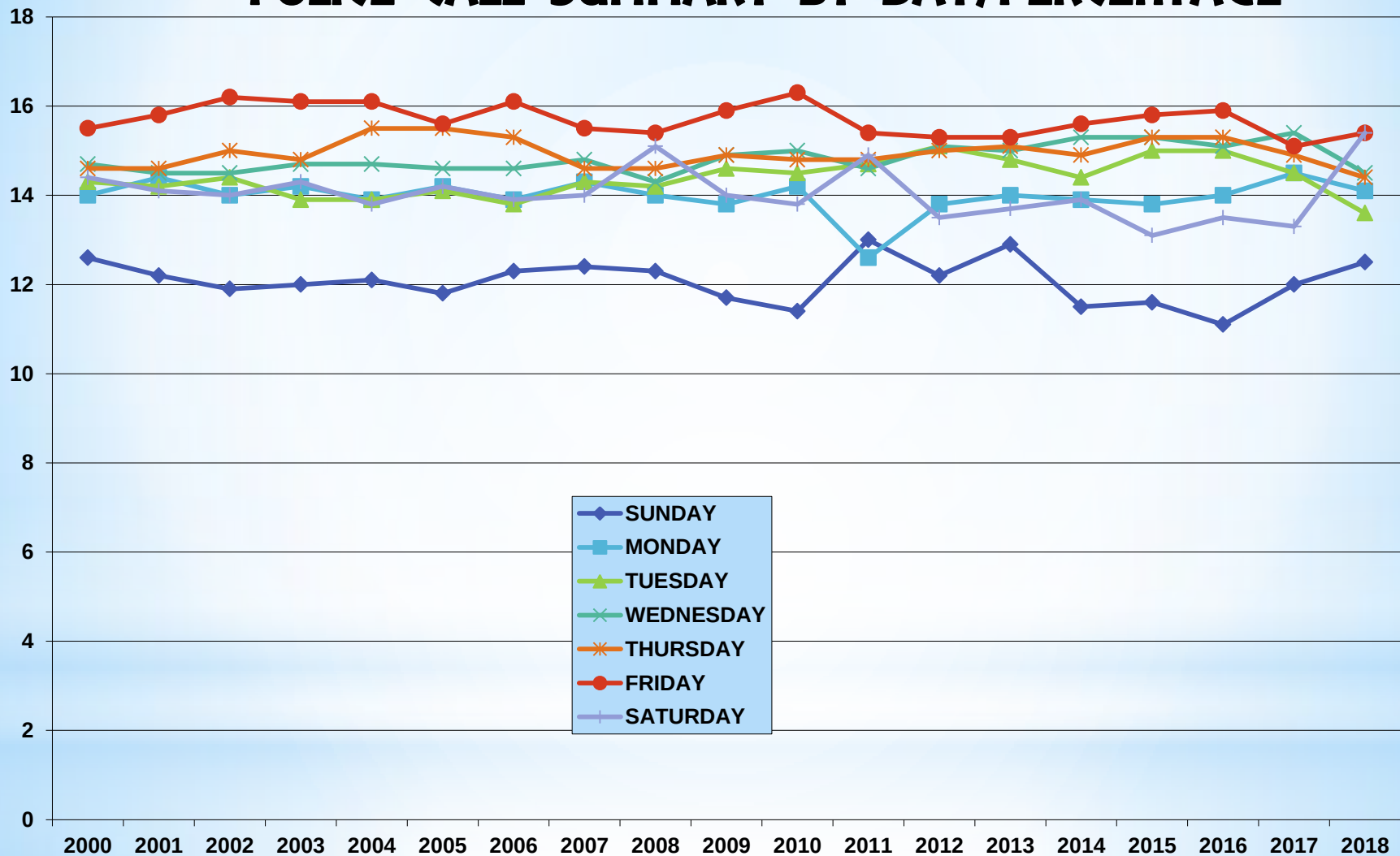
Police Priority Calls



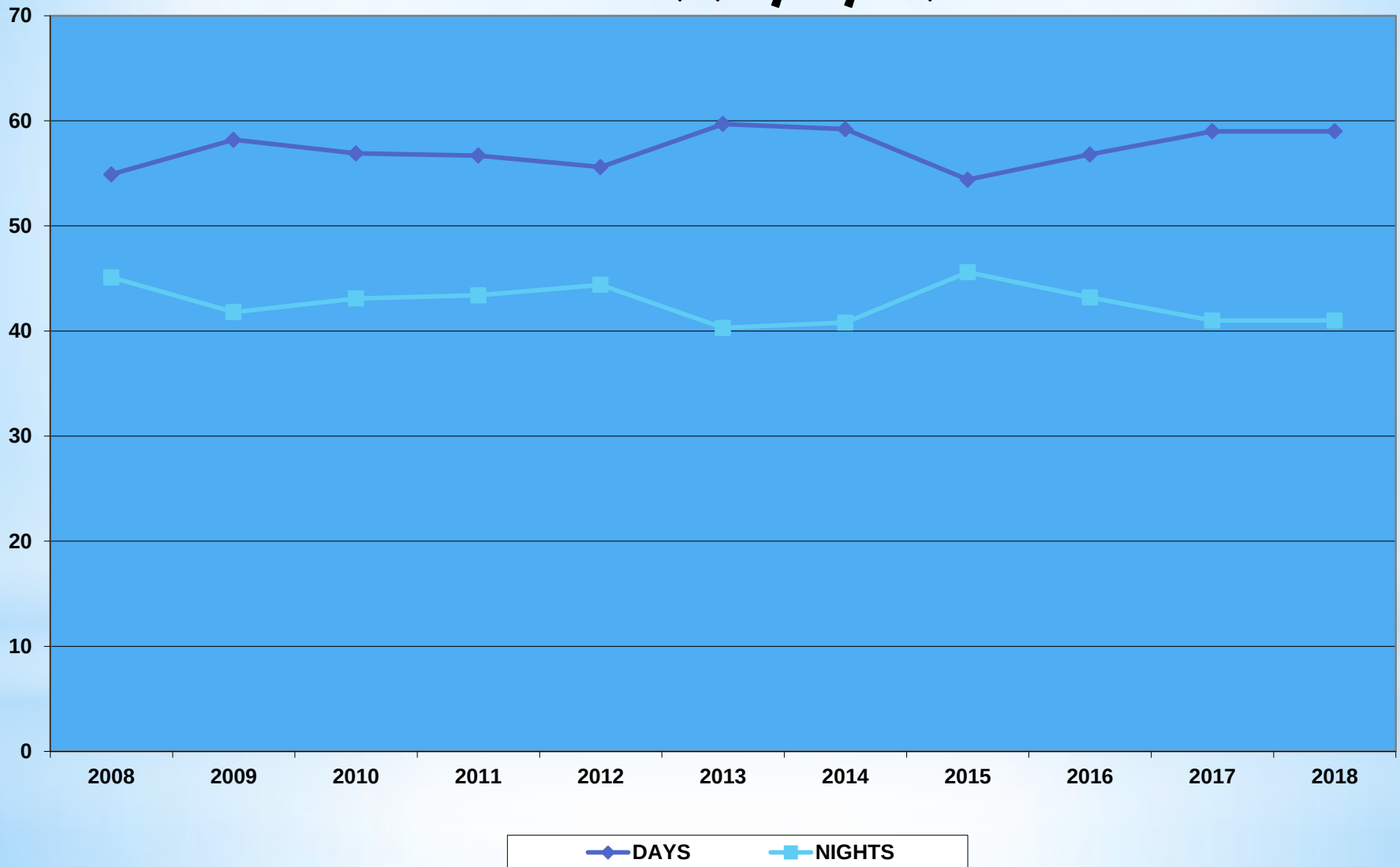
Police Response Time Dispatch to Arrival



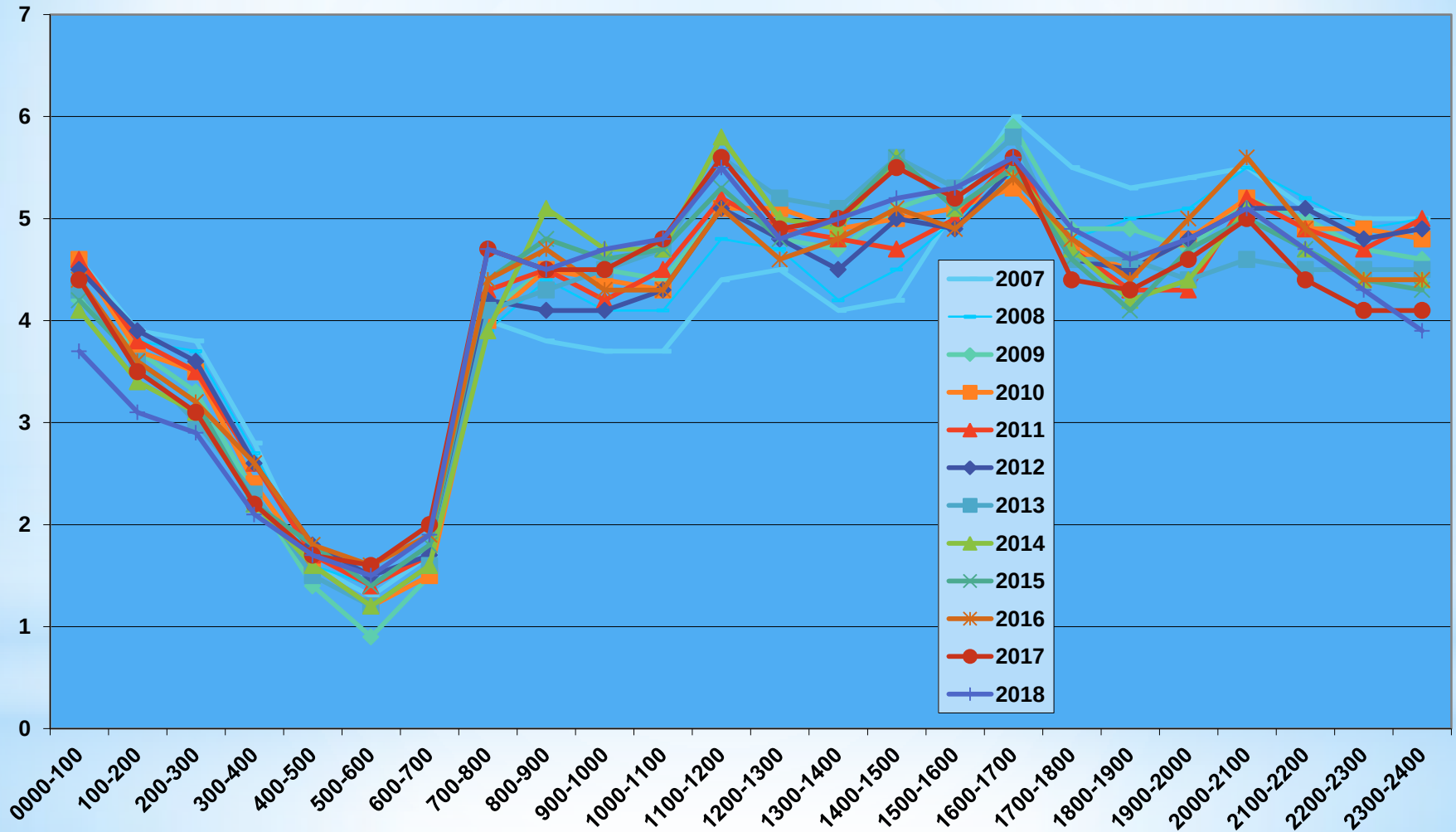
POLICE CALL SUMMARY BY DAY/PERCENTAGE



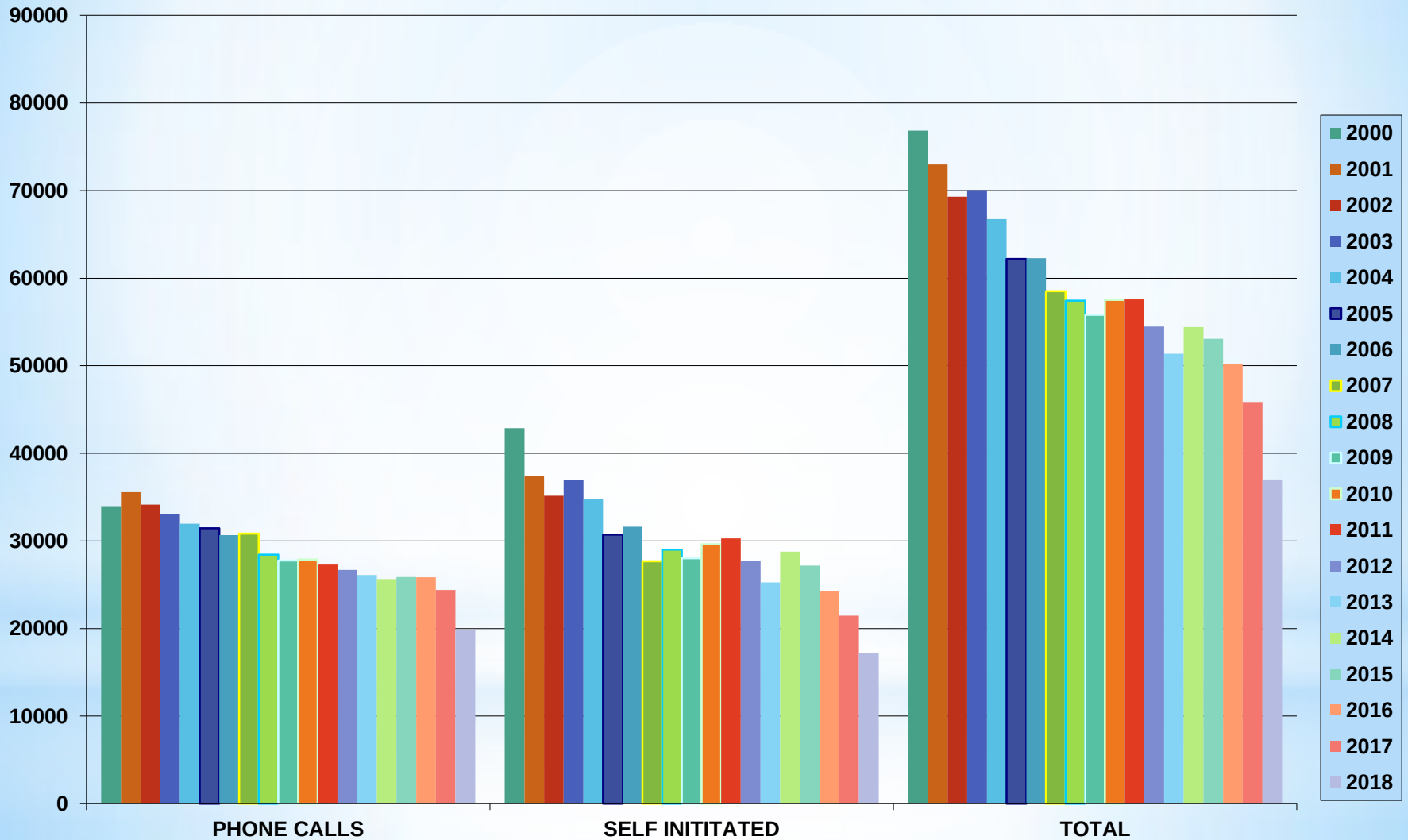
Call Summary by Shift



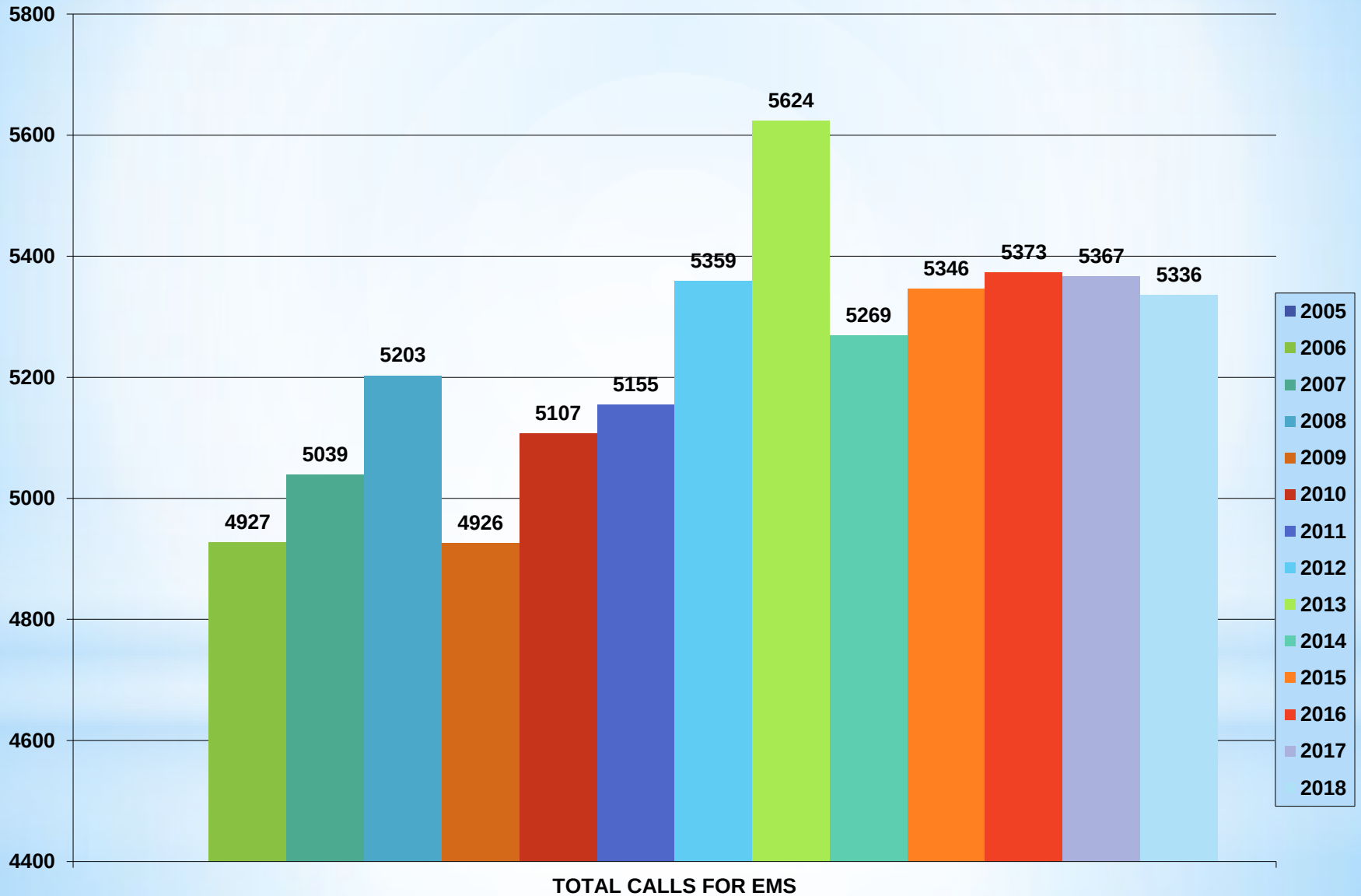
Call Summary by Hour/Percentage
